Delhigh Goes Wine Tasting at the Vynecrest Winery

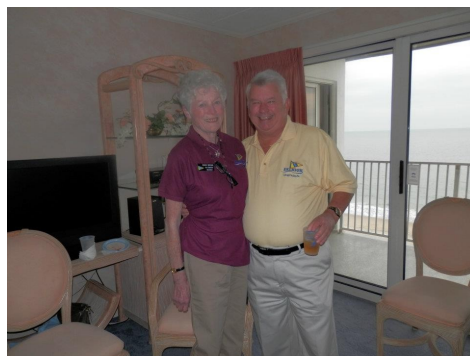

He has demonstrated the ability to conduct VSC's, educate the public on safety requirements, and help boost the image of Delhigh Power Squadron and USPS.

Delhigh VSE's once again participated in the National Safe Boating Week Campaign at Beltzville Lake, 19 May.

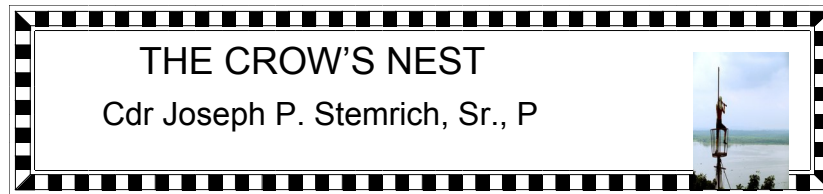

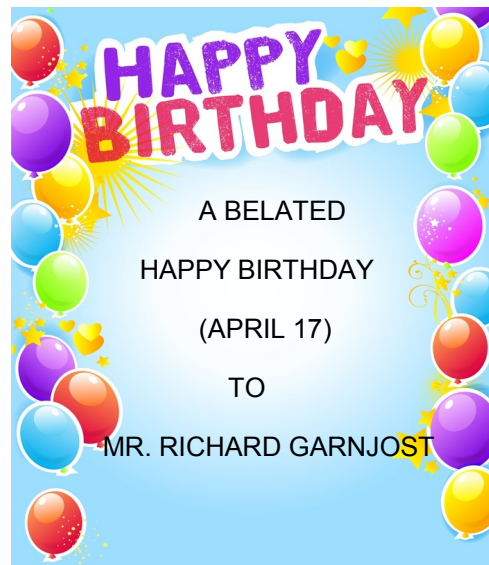

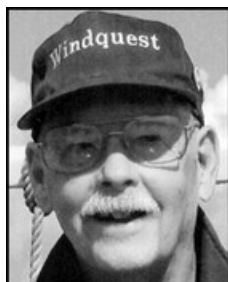

Now I can BS with a little more certainty. I hope you enjoy the June Celestial calendar as I have copied it from the Ensign Magazine web page.



24 The Ensign Spring 2012

June 2012

- 1 In the southeast early this evening, **Saturn** and **Spica** are 1½ fist-widths to the moon's upper right, and **Mars** is another 4 fist-widths beyond. **Scorpius** rises far to the lower left.
- 2 June 5th around 5:30 PM and with a proper pair of sun shielding glasses look for the planet Jupiter to pass in front of the sun. You should be able to see this right through sunset
- 3 Rising a half hour before sunset, the nearly full moon is high in the south or southeast by midnight. **Antares**, the heart of the Scorpion, is 2 finger-widths to the moon's lower left. The moon is at **perigee**, 56.21 Earth radii (358,000 kilometers) away.
- 4 The **full moon** rises a half hour after sunset and is low in the southwest by morning. Before dawn, a **partial lunar eclipse** is visible for most of the United States.
- 8 High in the south at first light, magnitude 0.9 **Altair** is far to the moon's upper right.
- 13 The moon rises 3½ hours before the sun, and just above the eastern horizon, brilliant magnitude -2.0 **Jupiter** rises 1¼ hours before sunrise.
- 16 The moon is at **apogee**, 63.62 Earth radii (406,000 kilometers) away.
- 17 **Jupiter** and the waning crescent moon rise 1½ hours before the sun. Jupiter is 1 finger-width to the moon's upper right, the **Pleiades** is 2½ finger-widths above the moon, and brilliant **Venus** is 3 finger-widths to the moon's lower left.
- 20 **Summer** begins at 2307 UT as the sun reaches its farthest point north of the celestial equator.
- 21 Look low in the west at dusk to see the moon close to the horizon with **Mercury** 4 finger-widths to the upper right.
- 23 An hour after sunset, look for the thin waxing crescent moon low in the west, 4 finger-widths below magnitude 1.3 **Regulus**.
- 25 **Mars** is 4 finger-widths above the moon in the southwest tonight.-
- 26 This evening **Mars** is 1 fist-width to the moon's upper right, and magnitude 0.7 **Saturn** is 2 fist-widths to the upper left. **Regulus** is just below Saturn.
- 27 **Regulus** is 2 finger-widths to the moon's upper left tonight, and **Saturn** is 2 finger-width above **Regulus**.
- 30 Tonight the moon is in the head of the Scorpion with magnitude 1.1 **Antares** 3 finger-widths to the lower left.

Dates to remember The summer solstice occurs on 20 June at 2307 UT, as the sun reaches its farthest point north of the celestial equator. In the Northern Hemisphere, the days are longer, and the nights are shorter.

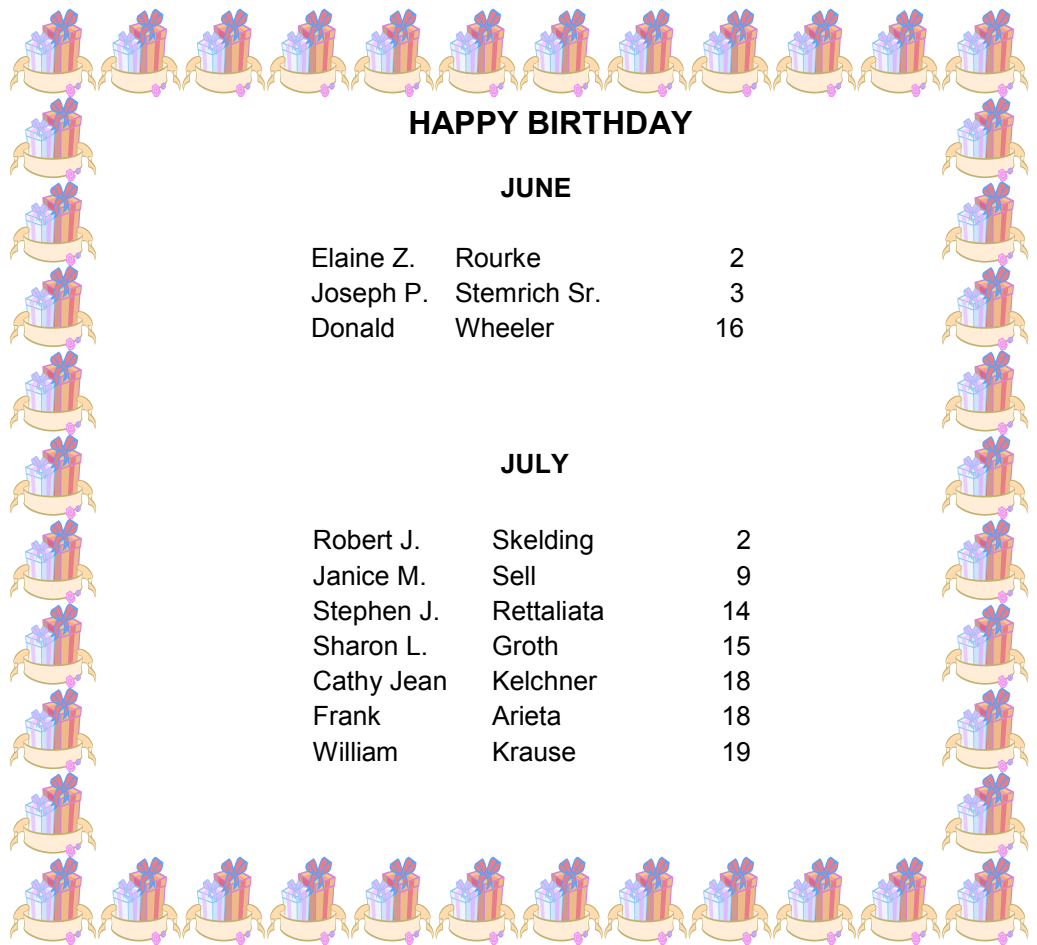

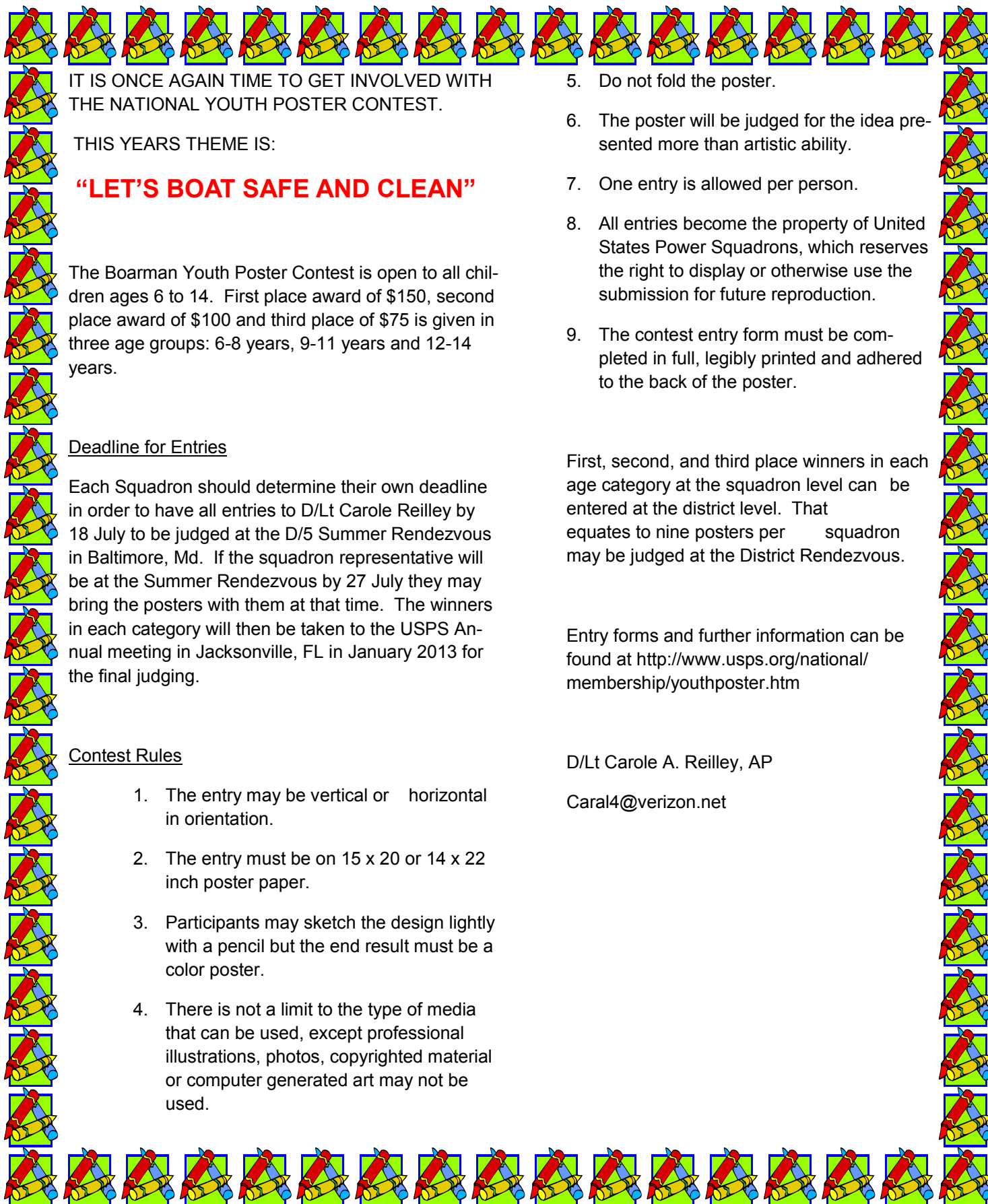

3. Participants may sketch the design lightly with a pencil but the end result must be a color poster.
4. There is not a limit to the type of media that can be used, except professional illustrations, photos, copyrighted material or computer generated art may not be used.

5. Do not fold the poster.
6. The poster will be judged for the idea presented more than artistic ability.
7. One entry is allowed per person.
8. All entries become the property of United States Power Squadrons, which reserves the right to display or otherwise use the submission for future reproduction.
9. The contest entry form must be completed in full, legibly printed and adhered to the back of the poster.

First, second, and third place winners in each age category at the squadron level can be entered at the district level. That equates to nine posters per squadron may be judged at the District Rendezvous.
