September 2012 Delhigh Meeting

NORTHAMPTON WATER RESCUE DIVE UNIT

In 1998, the Northampton Fire Department acquired the Water Rescue Dive Unit from the now Northampton Regional EMS and began to build a team. Today this team consists of eight divers and ten water rescue/ support personnel. They currently operate a GMC Suburban rescue truck and two boats.

The September meeting featured speakers from both the Northampton Fire Department and the Water Rescue Dive Unit. Captain Mike Booke of the Water Rescue Dive Unit, and Captain Keith Knoblach, II, of the Northampton Fire Company, gave a presentation on water rescue.

Captain Booke told us about the Unit's participation in assisting not only in Northampton County but counties within a 30 mile radius. They travel wherever they are requested, for whatever type of operation is needed. The Unit has helped rescue individuals sitting on roof tops or hanging onto trees in flooded areas, recovered evidence for law enforcement and (an always unpleasant task) searched for drowning victims.

Capt. Booke said a lot of victims drown in three feet or less of water. Panic is what takes over and they lose sense of how to help save themselves. Lakes, rivers, and quarries in this and surrounding areas keep Capt. Booke and the dive team on their toes. They also assist and work with approximately nine other Dive Units in the area. Most units are certified in a specialized area. The individuals who make up these units are continually being educated and certified not only in water rescue but in the constant changing technology and equipment world of rescue.

Captain Booke and Captain Knoblach answered questions from the membership and we then proceeded outside to see the rescue dive team's equipment and an on-land demonstration.

The equipment ranged from scuba tanks, weights, air lines, and ropes with makers. The on-land demonstration/ presentation included use of hand signals, working in pairs for safety, and the use of their 15 feet Zodiac inflatable boat with Honda engine and much more.

Capt. Booke, Capt. Knoblach and the men and women who devote their time to keep us safe and come to our aid in time of need are all non-paid dedicated volunteers who believe in what they do. I have always had respect for our volunteer fireman and water rescue teams but this presentation has taken that respect to a whole different level.



Soon most the boats will start to be put to rest for a winter nap. Shrink wrap, winterized, equipment stowed, and all the final preparations to make opening in spring easier.

Now is a good time to take a close look at your State and Federal Regulations and safety items. Review the list of items found on your VSC Checklist, given to you by your Vessel Safety Examiner upon completing the VSC.

Did you receive a Decal? Thank you for taking the time to be safe and be in compliance with State and Federal regulations. If you did not receive a Decal, did you correct the item or items? You have a few months to get things ready for your Vessel Safety Check in spring so you can display your new 2013 VSC Decal.

This is also a good time to think about which course you want to take to enhance your boating knowledge. Look at it this way, how do you want to spend your time in cold weather.... watching 258 channels of nothing good on TV... falling asleep on that favorite chair, or taking a class to keep you up to date with all the new things happening in the boating world. It's your call.

Vessel Examiners, PLEASE, send your completed forms to me so they can be logged in with National. It's that time of year for National to compile all the VSC information. The deadline for me to log in all forms is 17 November 2012. I will also be contacting the VSE's to find out the status of their PFD supplied to us by the USCG. I must complete the form and send this information in by 15 November 2012




