Robert Condit Muir, Jr.

Robert Condit Muir, Jr., 94, died peacefully at Lehigh Valley Hospital Hospice Center Thursday, August 29, 2013. He was born April 18, 1919, in St. Albans, Queens, NY. Robert graduated from Hempstead High School in Queens, NY. He attended Lehigh University, class of 1940. His college career was interrupted by World War II, shortly before his graduation. Robert joined the United States Army, was selected for flight school and joined the U.S. Army Air Corps. He was promoted to the rank of Captain. He became a flight instructor in basic flight school and trained hundreds of pilots to fly the B-17 Flying Fortress and later the B-29 Superfortress, the bomber that ended the war in Japan. The University gave an honorary Bachelor of Arts degree to Robert, at the age of 92, on December 7, 2011. Robert worked for the Glidden Paint Company and Berman Truck Leasing and was the owner of Hunsicker Printing. Robert was an avid sailor until his early 90s and was active in the DELHIGH Power Squadron of the US Power Squadrons. Robert is survived by his sons, Anthony M. Muir and wife Sara (JoJo) of Allentown, PA and Robert C. Muir III (Jock) and wife Elana of Hertford, NC; also surviving are 5 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren.

Robert Richard Dales, 76, of Oriental, NC passed away Sunday, September 29, 2013, at home. He was a foreman of Fritz Lab and ATLSS Lab over a period of 40 years at Lehigh University. He was a life member of Delhigh Power Squadron in Pennsylvania, a member of Sailing Club of Oriental (SCOO), and the Oriental Dinghy Club (ODC) of which he was Commodore in 2008, Bob was a volunteer fireman with Southeast Pamlico Volunteer Fire Dept. #19 and was named Fireman of the Year both in 2002 and 2013. He was also a recipient of the prestigious Bill Mason award from the Oriental Rotary Club in 2013. Bob was preceded in death by his parents, Alfred and Jean Pines Dales and his brother. Mark Dales. He is survived by his wife of 53 years, Marge Dales; his sister-in-law, Carolyn Dales of Southampton, PA; nephews: Mark Dales Jr. and David Dales; and nieces: Diane Mattson and Debi Hester.

Cooking aboard

Safety tips for onboard cooking

Cooking aboard requires some thought toward safety.

Charcoal grills

If using a charcoal grill, make sure you have plenty of ventilation—whether you're in a calm anchorage or at the dock. Burning charcoal produces carbon monoxide, a deadly gas. Grills designed for boats clamp on to the rails in an open area. If you plan to use charcoal, learn how to dispose of leftovers legally and safely.

Gas grills

Propane grills provide a safer alternative to charcoal; however, you should never grill inside a cabin or under a canvas enclosure. If you use gas cylinders for your grill, don't store them in the cabin or any enclosed area. Store them in cylinder bags hung off the rails or in the open. The cylinders can leak from bouncing around in the boat.

Stoves

The most common methods suitable for galley cooking are alcohol, propane, compressed gas and electric. Each will cook your food, but cooking times vary.

When purchasing alcohol, make sure the alcohol you purchase is for marine stoves. Never use denatured alcohol.

The most commonly used fuels aboard, propane (LPG) and compressed natural gas (CNG) provide a quicker, hotter cooking surface. I recommend using pot brackets to prevent spills.

Observe basic safety practices for all gaseous fuels. Secure tanks in a well-ventilated area. Ensure that all stove lines are in good condition with no corrosion or cracks. Check fittings for tightness throughout the season. There should be no odor, even when cooking.

Considered the cleanest and safest way to cook aboard, electric stoves usually can only be used when you are docked with proper shore power available. Many larger boats have their own generators; however, using stoves and electric appliances without shore power requires a considerable amount of generator power.

Kerosene, gasoline and Coleman fuel aren't recommended for cooking onboard. They give off toxic fumes and aren't easily controlled. Gasoline fumes are explosive. Portable stoves and cookers aren't recommended for onboard use.

Any galley stove must be well-ventilated. Keep all smoke filters and connectors clean and in good condition. If using an exhaust fan, keep it clean and grease-free.

For the safety of you and your family, install a battery-operated carbon monoxide alarm in the cabin or galley area. Carbon monoxide is colorless and heavier than air, so install the alarm lower for best protection.
