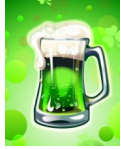

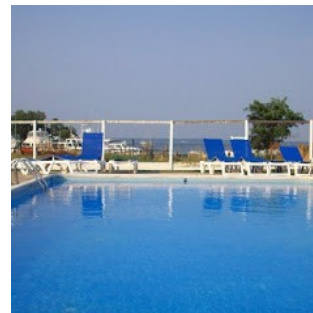
Saturday is on your own for bike rides or a raft up or a drive through town and dinner will be at Harrison House, I've heard the food here is a must have!

Lighting the way....

As we approach our 100-year anniversary with USPS, I felt it important to understand where we began in order to understand where we will be going as a squadron. We have a very storied history. I have borrowed the following excerpts from our Historians site.

Roger Upton was a sailing member of the Boston Yacht Club in 1909 but, unlike so many other sailors, the newfangled powerboats captivated him. He owned a 50-foot ketch named *Nirvana* and often cruised up the coast to Maine. Because he was a businessman, and because wind power was so often unreliable, he bought a 35-foot motor launch with a gasoline engine to serve as tender for the ketch and to tow her when she was becalmed. The following year he installed a 20-horsepower convertible kerosene-gasoline engine in the ketch, making it possible for him to return to his business on time. The reliability of power appealed to him and he grew to love power boating.

How long the idea incubated in Upton's mind we'll never know, but in the summer of 1911 he spread his thoughts before a small group of his colleagues at the Boston Yacht Club. Upton's idea was for a club-within-a-club, to embrace a select group of "gasoliners" who would develop such forms of cruising and racing as the new type of yachts allowed. To quote from one of his articles, "To my mind the organization can be of use to yachtsmen for three major reasons: first, improvement in navigating ability of power-boat owners; second, promotion of acquaintance and social intercourse by the power-boat owners; third, the fitting of power-boat owners to be of possible use to the Navy in time of war so that they might be received as volunteers should they so desire."

During the summer of 1912, twenty Power Boat Division vessels were invited to go with forty windjammers on the annual Boston Yacht Club cruise to Portland, Maine. The powerboats cruised in squadron formation with an elaborate system of maneuvers executed by means of flag signals. During the cruise a screeching nor'wester blew up. Many of the sailing yachts were dismasted or otherwise disabled. The power yachts under Upton's command went to their rescue, towing disabled craft to port. No losses were reported. To quote the September 1912 issue of *Motor Boating Magazine*, which dramatized the rescue with a six-page photo story, "The fellows of the Powerboat Division provided meritorious service and emerged from the ordeal crowned with glory."

On 14 October 1912, the Executive Committee of the Boston Yacht Club, petitioning the club to officially establish his Power Boat Division, read a letter from Rear Commodore Roger Upton. As the minutes of that meeting disclose, the Executive Committee granted Mr. Upton's petition unanimously. At the annual meeting in January 1913, the name was changed to "Power Squadron" and the club-within-a-club was officially recognized. Its officers and rules were printed in the 1913 Boston Yacht Club Yearbook. Officers were Roger Upton, commander; C. N. Burnell, lieutenant commander; and Nathaniel L. Stebbins, a noted Boston marine photographer, secretary.

Franklin Delano Roosevelt, then assistant secretary of the Navy and an honorary member of the Boston Yacht Club, had observed Power Squadron drills as a guest aboard Upton's yacht, Elizabeth. He had been greatly impressed with the activities of the Power Squadron and had sent his aide, Captain William F. Fullam, to attend the meeting. As was reported in the press, Captain Fullam praised the organization in the highest terms possible and complimented the officers for the training they were providing with their naval-type drills. As a footnote, it should be added that two years later Mr. Roosevelt was instrumental in transforming the Revenue Cutter Service and the Lifesaving Service into the United States Coast Guard, which, during World War I, provided coastal patrols as part of the Navy.

The yachting community took great interest in that November 1913 conference at the New York Yacht Club. The cause and the men who supported it were applauded editorially by leading newspapers in the Northeast. The Boston Globe of Sunday, 16 November 1913, said, "The delegates at the conference were men of weight in the yachting world. There was great interest manifested and, in all probability, the [organization] will have the name 'United States Power Squadrons'.

One common thread still holds true to this day, we as Power Squadron members will always stop to help another boat or party in need. Every member I know has a story to share on how they were there in some else's time in need. It was what we do and who we are as Power Squadron members.

To complement this strong moral compass, we as USPS members have a strong passion for life. Some enjoy their passions more than others, and probably more than they should; yet it is what makes us work so well as an organization and as an extended family. Many memories made and many more to come.

There are many events on this year's calendar. I would like to thank this year's incoming bridge and executive committee for their help in planning this year's events. It was great to see some faces we had not seen for awhile at the change of watch. If you are reading this and we have not seen you, I encourage you to join us, even if for just one event this year. Feel free to bring a friend; we would love to have you!

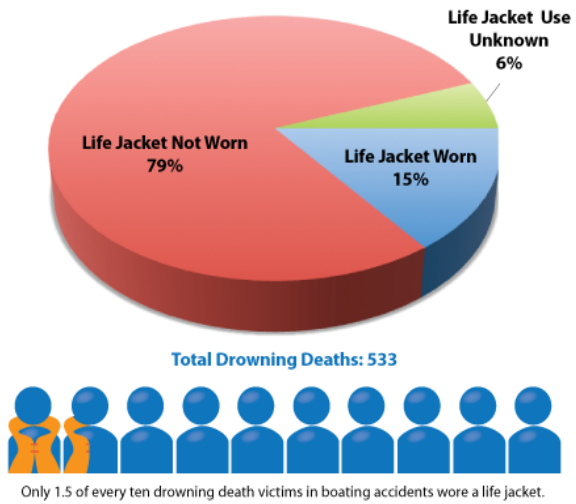

RECREATIONAL BOATING FATALITY STATISTICS

Wearing a Life Jacket is Still the Most Important Step Boaters Can Take to Ensure Their Safety on the Water

2011 Recreational Boating Drownings



Boating fatalities jumped 12.8 percent in 2011 and are now at the highest level since 1998, according to the U.S. Coast Guard's just released report 2011 Recreational Boating Statistics.

Last year, 533 of the 758 boating fatalities resulted from drowning, with 84 percent of the drowning victims not reported as wearing a life jacket.

Vessel Safety Corner

It's that time of the year again.

Soon the shrink wrap will be taken off and the boat prep begins.

This is the perfect time to get out last year's VSC form and check all the items on the list to make sure everything is in working order. As part of the preparation and cleanup, we need to pay attention to safety items. Have your flares expired? Are your fire extinguishers properly charged? Do your lights work properly? What condition are your life jackets in, etc.?

Our squadron has several certified vessel safety examiners who are qualified to examine your boat to ensure compliance of State and Federal Regulations as set by the U.S. Coast Guard safety requirements, as well as for additional safe boating suggestions.

These vessel safety checks are free of charge and permit you to correct any discrepancies and obtain both a certificate of successful examination and a decal for your boat as evidence of your compliance.

If you or any boaters you know would like to have a VSC please contact:

Vessel Safety Chairman P/C Michael Lebeduik, III at (610) – 691-3348. He will assign the closest Certified Examiner to you to conduct the vessel safety check.

Boating Safely

Beware of E15 Fuels in Boats

WASHINGTON – Boaters who fuel their boats from the same pumps as their vehicle may be at risk of unknowingly or mistakenly putting 15% ethanol and 85% gasoline into an engine for which E15 has not been approved.

Only one small label is required on the pump to warn boaters of the 50 percent increase in ethanol. The Coast Guard Auxiliary recommends only fueling boats from tanks at marinas.

On January 21, 2011 the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) granted a waiver that allows the percentage of ethanol in the nation's gasoline supply to jump from 10% (E10) to 15% (E15) to be sold only for cars, SUVs and light-duty trucks made in 2001 through 2006. This decision comes on the heels of an October 13th decision to waive the limitations for so-called E15 for model-year 2007 and newer cars and light-duty trucks. This EPA waiver does not permit use of the higher alcohol content fuel in lawnmowers, chainsaws, snowmobiles, motorcycles or boats.

Many components on a boat could come in contact with ethanol-laden gasoline, including fuel lines, fuel tanks, fuel pumps, fuel injectors, carburetors, pressure regulators, valves, o-rings, and gaskets. The compatibility of these components with any blend greater than E10 is currently unknown. The failure of only one of these components in your engine could lead to failure or, worse, a fire or explosion.

Contest Rules

1. Each district may submit one poster in each age category. Squadron entries must be judged at the district level prior to being submitted to national. The judging deadline for each squadron and district is to be set locally.
2. The entry may be vertical or horizontal in orientation.
3. **The entry must be on poster board or paper 15 x 20 or 14 x 22 inches.**
4. Participants may sketch the design lightly with a pencil, but the end result must be a color poster.
5. Professional illustrations, photos, copyrighted material, purchased or computer generated art may not be used.
6. Do not fold the poster.
7. The poster will be judged for the idea presented more than artistic ability.
8. One entry is allowed per person. All entries become the property of United States Power Squadrons®, which reserves the right to display or otherwise use the submission for future reproduction.
9. It is important that the contest entry form be completed in full, legibly printed and adhered to the back of the poster.
