

I'd also like to recognize my son, Eric, who is not here today, but who has been a key member of our family and crew throughout the years.

Brent, you've done a wonderful job of organizing the ceremony, as usual, and we thank you for your continued commitment to making our Change-of-Watch ceremonies a professional event with proper USPS protocol.

Ed Muschlitz, we appreciate your efforts in organizing and leading our Honor Guard, and on that note, a sincere thank you to the members who participated in the today's Guard.

It is indeed an honor to stand before you, and accept the command of Delhigh. This is the 48th Change-of-Watch for our squadron, and I am truly excited to be part of an organization so rich in tradition and longevity. There have been many, many, fine, dedicated individuals that held this office in the past, and I will do my best in honoring their hard work by moving Delhigh forward.

But what makes this event more special for me than even the new responsibilities and challenges is being among the friends and family today who have been such a huge part of my boating life.

We bought our first boat in 1986, and after a trip or two to Lake Wallenpaupack and the Finger Lakes, I decided to take the Coast Guard Safe Boating course. It was a very good course. I certainly learned a lot as a new boater, and to be honest, had no plans to take more courses or participate in organized boating until I got invited to join my river friends as a guest for my first Delhigh Rendezvous. These folks had all taken the USPS Safe Boating Course and had already joined Delhigh. I'm glad they called me. I have to admit the excitement and camaraderie of taking a boating trip, and the rendezvous itself, got me and my family hooked, and the next fall, I too, took the USPS course and in 1989 joined Delhigh.

Over the years we've had some wonderful trips and great times. Most of our vacations since that time have been on the water. Our friends, as a boating group, have traveled the Rideau Canal system and the Thousand Islands in Canada. We've gone to Montreal and Quebec City on the St. Lawrence several times; Lake Champlain; the Finger Lakes; the Jersey Shore; the Hudson River; the Erie Canal, Wallenpaupack; parts of the inter-coastal; and the Chesapeake Bay, from one end to the other. And of course, the Delhigh Rendezvous...by now we've attended nearly 20 of them.

Trailer boating with family, friends and members of Delhigh has been a real experience - one I would not change for anything.

We've towed boats, and been towed. Along the road we've fixed flats, wheel bearings, lights, brakes, transmissions, tie down straps, tarps, winches, cables and rollers.

On the water, we've repaired carburetors, water pumps, fuel pumps, electrical circuits, battery failures, throttle cables, radios, canvases, zippers, hatches, ladders, lines, and fenders...not to mention out drives, props, water in the gas, crud in the water, and leaks. (And that was just Dave's boat).

We've laughed till we cried. We've told jokes and sang songs. We played cards, walked everywhere, ate together, hung out, and toasted each other. We've shared tools, parts, food, booze, milk, towels, lines, charts, ideas, information, money - and even kids.

We sometimes got mad at each other.....but always made up.

And why was this such a big part of our lives? Well, the friendships we developed; the magnetic pull of the water; (if there is such a thing), our boats; adventure; and of course, Delhigh.

Our squadron has served many people. Thousands have learned the essentials of boating from our qualified and dedicated instructors. We've been blessed with strong leadership, committed members, unwavering support from District and National, a supportive community, and the desire to learn, travel, explore and socialize with individuals with the same interests.

So as we look to the future, where will we go? How can we salute the hard work of so many people over our 48 years, and move Delhigh to even greater levels? What can **we** do to make Delhigh even more successful today than it has been?



I'd like to draw your attention to the centerpieces at your tables. As I thought about what our squadron's mission might be in '09, I narrowed all of our activities to three things:

Membership......Education......Safe Boating.

MEMBERSHIP: In the last several years we've seen membership decline. That's not unusual for any club today, but our goal is to reverse that trend at Delhigh. Increased pressure from state agencies to complete and pass safe boating courses gives us the opportunity to teach, interact with, and recruit new members. New Cooperative Charting Program for 2009 NOAA-USPS D/5 Workshop

The 2009 workshop at the Atlantic Marine Center, Norfolk, VA, on 102 May will feature a dual track training approach wherein one track will emphasize the non-technical cooperative charting activities and the second track will emphasize depth surveys. Both tracks will cover planning, data gathering requirements, data collection, and submission of a report using CCWeb (Cooperative Charting Website).

When asked about the value of USPS cooperative charting efforts, Douglas Harpine, Senior Cartographer, Nautical Chart Branch, NOAA, said that, "If USPS didn't do the work, the work would not get done." Cooperative Charting is an area where USPS can make a difference for the safety of all recreational boaters.

Cooperative Charting is fun! It is a squadron activity you can do immediately after becoming a USPS member. Hope to see you 1-2 May 2009 at the NOAA - USPS D/5 workshop.
