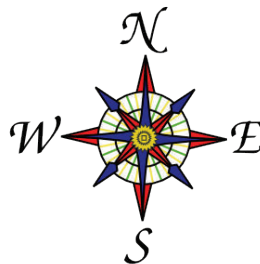

Delhigh Salutes New Yardarm

After many years of service to Delhigh, our ceremonial Yardarm was retired at this year's Change-of-Watch and replaced with a new one symbolizing the advancements we have made as a squadron.

Past Commander Michael Lebeduik, P undertook the assignment of designing and constructing the 7' Yardarm this past winter. "I've been wanting to do this for years," commented the Past Commander during one of his work sessions, "but never got to it. Now, as we prepare for our 50th anniversary, it was time to make it happen."

Constructed out of PVC pipe, the new, free standing Yardarm flies the U.S. Flag, the Delhigh Burgee, and 8 officers' flags. To capture the history of our 49 previous years, sections of the old Yardarm were integrated into the new one. This idea and design insures that Delhigh continues to recognize and salute the previous leaders and officers who worked to make Delhigh what it is today.

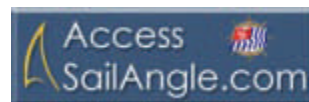

USPS® Headquarters has announced an important development in the enrollment process for SailAngle.com. All squadron members can now be enrolled automatically into SailAngle. This process eliminates the need for each member to enroll individually, and will insure that you will receive USPS information through this website.

Future correspondence with the United States Power Squadrons will be done through SailAngle. To get enrolled, you do not have to do anything. Once enrolled, SailAngle will contact you through your regular e-mail address.

Delhigh has several certified Vessel Safety Examiners (VSE's), who are qualified to examine your vessel to continue to be in compliance with the U. S. Coast Guard safety

requirements.

We may also make additional suggestions to make your boating year a more safe and enjoyable season.

These examinations are without charge ** FREE ** and will allow you to correct any discrepancies. Upon completion you will be awarded a decal to show your certificate of successful examination and that your vessel is in compliance.

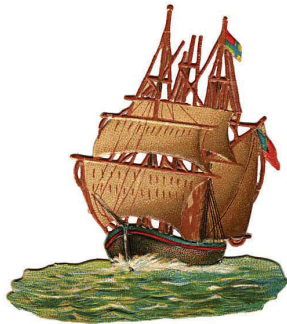

Delhigh Merit Mark Recipients

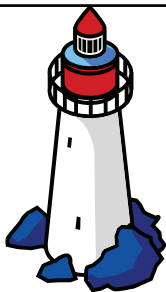

Boating Safety

Hello Everyone,

Please remember when you're performing your spring time check list and getting your boat ready for warm weather, don't forget to check those flares. Did you know that they have an expiration date? If they do require replacing, keep the old ones for just in case; chances are they may still work. But best to keep up to date ones on board in a dry place. Here is a quick public reference direct from the USCG.

Distress Signals Required (33 CFR 175.110, 175.130 and 175.135)

No person may use a boat 16 feet or more in length or any boat operating as an uninspected passenger vessel unless visual distress signals are carried and are readily accessible. Any of the following distress signals can be used to meet the distress signal requirements:

- a. An electric distress signal light which is Coast Guard-approved and marked to meet the requirement of 46 CFR 161.013 as a visual night distress signal.
- b. An orange flag which has been certified as Coast Guard-approved and marked meet to the requirements of 46 CFR 160.072 as a visual day distress signal.

c. Pyrotechnics listed in 33 CFR Table 175.130 below. Any combination of the signal devices selected from subparagraphs a. and b. above and the table, carried in the number required, meets the requirement. Examples: The combination of two hand-held red flares (160.021), and one parachute red flare (160.024 or 160.036) meets both day and night requirements. Three hand orange smoke (160.037) with one electric distress light (160.013) meets both day and night requirements. Approval # Under 46 CFR	Device Description	Meets Requirements for	Number Required
