Orion Skyblazer Red Aerial Flare Revised Use Instructions October 8, 2008



Orion Safety Products, manufacturer of the Skyblazer handlaunched red aerial flare ("Skyblazer"), previously received a report indicating the safety sleeve on the Skyblazer may become detached from the launch tube body during ignition (see diagram below for visual depiction of parts). A report from the field indicates that upon this occurrence, users experienced bruised knuckles, a punctured finger nail and a lacerated finger in at least one instance.



Disassembled Skyblazer


Since issuing a Safety Notice and Product Quarantine on September 26, 2008, Orion has tested hundreds of Skyblazer signals from a variety of manufacturing lots and determined the product functions as intended without injury to the user if the product is held properly in accordance with the use instructions on the product. Specifically, the user must hold the Launch Tube Body (not the Safety Sleeve alone) tightly in the upper hand during launch.

While the use instructions on Skyblazers manufactured before September 26, 2008 inform the user to "grasp tube body firmly", Orion is reissuing the instructions to make it clear that the grasping the Safety Sleeve alone is not adequate to withstand the recoil caused by the aerial launch process. <u>ALL USERS OF THE ORION</u> <u>SKYBLAZER SHOULD USE THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS</u> <u>WHEN USING THIS PRODUCT</u>:

Step 1:



Press top of launch tube down with thumb to unlock sleeve - launch tube will drop down.
