USPS 2014 Annual Meeting – Centennial Celebration

Bea and my trip to this year's USPS Annual Meeting could have started off a disaster. You see, originally I had looked at flights with Delta, my preferred airline. However, once I started comparing prices and more importantly, the schedules, US Airways had the best of both. Had we stuck with Delta, we might STILL be in Atlanta, as the day we flew to Jacksonville was the day Atlanta was crippled with a snow storm, virtually shutting down the city (and the airport) for days.

Thus, having avoided disaster, all we had to do was relax, enjoy the conference and simply have some fun; and that's exactly what we did. Bea requested that I write an article about this conference and the subsequent centennial cruise. Had I done so back when she asked, this wouldn't have seemed as redundant as it is now. After all, by now I'm certain you all have seen the Mark 5 and our D/5 Commander Marty's article, right? He portrayed both beautifully, thus the redundancy. That's when I decided to re-title and refocus this article to:

USPS Safe Boating Education– The Game Changer!

Let me introduce you to the game changer – it's called the Boating Safety Virtual Trainer:



What you see in the previous column is a boat simulator – the brain-child of USPS who partnered with the virtual reality company who built this. The prototype was on display and demonstrated at the Annual Meeting. The first fully operational unit will be unveiled in May of this year. USPS has ten on order once all the final tweaks are complete.

What you can't see in this picture is how "real" the experience actually is. While sitting at the helm there are paddles alongside the steering wheel that let you pan to the right and to the left to view what you would actually see turning your head left or right. The throttle and the steering act just like you're in an actual boat. Here the "boat" is approaching a dock. The operator came in a little too fast and BANG – you heard it bang up against the dock. Out in the lake there's a string of buoys set up like an obstacle course for you to maneuver around; there are other boats, sail and power simulating crossings and overtaking maneuvers.

The simulator can also adjust things like wind and current speed and direction – and this was just the prototype! The final version(s) will be just like the real deal; wind, current, wave action – it will be just like operating a real boat. The exciting thing on top of it all is the price. When I first saw it I went "catching" - \$100,000, easy. When I heard they were around \$10K I was floored. Plus, as the demand goes up – the price comes down.

Given a past D/5 DEO is chairing the project (Bob Palmer) don't think for a moment D/5 won't realize a little special consideration. Now think about it. We get the Morning Call and Peter's to promote a Boating Course – advertising that the course will include a sneak peek at the USPS Boating Safety Virtual Trainer – which we let them play with, but just enough for a taste of what they can get access to by joining USPS. Or maybe we can actually incorporate it into the Public Boating Course and charge a premium for the privilege!

We've said it for years – how do we compete against free? With the state courses being given for free, up until now we couldn't. It's going to take some effort to work out the logistics – but at the end of the day, as the title indicates –

It's a Game Changer for USPS and Delhigh!

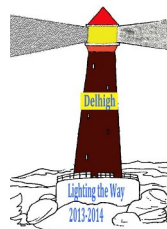

We need to start checking all the mechanical, electrical and cooling systems on our crafts simply because it's easier and cheaper to do it now rather than after you've broken down.

Don't forget to have a VSC conducted on your boat. These examinations are without charge - FREE - and will allow you to correct any discrepancies. Upon completion you will be awarded a decal to show your certificate of successful examination and that your vessel is in compliance.

All Vessel Safety Examiner's must be recertified by 30 June 2014. Delhigh will contact the VSE's and set a date for our examiners to attend a class and become recertified.
