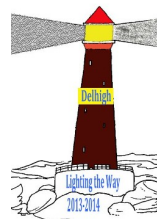

Vessel Safety Check

Delhigh has received 2015 VSC stickers so members should feel free to contact an examiner this spring as soon as they are ready to open their boat and have an examination done.

Examiners can get 2015 stickers from P/C Michael Lebeduik, III.

Safety

While you have time during the winter, take the time to check your gear and make sure that it is in good working order! Check your fire extinguisher and don't forget to make sure that you replace it when it is more than 7 years old, the date is on the bottom. Check your PFDs for rips or tears or mold and make sure that all of your zippers and snaps are working. Check the date on your flares. Make sure that all of the gear that you brought home is ready to go out as soon as it's warm enough to open her up and then you can have fun without worrying about your gear. This way, if it's not up to par, you have plenty of time to order new gear before boating season begins! Boat safe and boat fun!

The season for boating is over, but the season for Delhigh's educational classes is just heating up! We are teaching the ABC class on 10 and 17 January 2015 at Peters Marine and have 31 students for the class! This is one of our bigger classes and it looks like we will be getting some new members from it! Thanks to all our dedicated teachers for making this happen!

Our new Piloting graduates are ready for Advanced Piloting, so that class will begin on 20 January at 1900. We will be meeting at the church the first week, then decide if we want to move the class to someone's house.

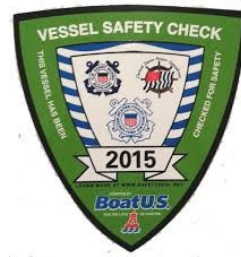

It is that time to think about what has to be done to your vessel to be in compliance with State and Federal Regulations.

Here is a check list to go over before having a Vessel Safety Check:

1. Registration number properly displayed
2. Registration / Documentation
3. Personal Flotation Devices
4. Visual Distress Signals
5. Fire Extinguishers
6. Ventilation
7. Backfire Flame Control
8. Sound Producing Devices / Bell
9. Navigation Lights
10. Pollution Placard
11. MARPOL Trash Placard
12. Marine Sanitation Devices
13. Navigation Rules
14. State and Local Requirements
15. Overall Vessel Condition

You will be awarded a 2015 VSC Decal upon passing the Vessel Safety Check.

Please give one of the Vessel Safety Examiners a call to have your boat checked.

Boating Safety



Tow riders safely

Be wary of CO emissions

Today's power boaters can tow an array of recreational devices behind their boats, from the thrilling wakeboards, wake skates and kneeboards, all with special tow rings and lines, to the more relaxing rafts and inner tubes.

Because of their popularity, towable devices call for extra care and attention to ensure rider safety. In addition to having everyone wear appropriately sized life jackets at all times, boaters should prepare for the unexpected—towlines coming loose and hidden obstructions that bounce riders around.

The exhaust from a gasoline-powered tow boat can be dangerous. According to the Center for Disease Control, open-air carbon monoxide exposure to exhaust from gasoline-powered generators on houseboats can cause serious illness and death; however, CO poisoning resulting from direct exposure to CO in the exhaust of a ski boat or recreational towing boat can also occur.

Says the CDC, "Ambient CO concentrations have been measured as high as 27,000 parts per million (ppm) in the stern of boats involved in CO-poisoning fatalities. In comparison, the World Health Organization has set a ceiling limit on a person's exposure to CO at 87 ppm during a 15-minute interval."

So when you buy that cute little towable device for the kids or grandchildren, be extra careful that they're nowhere near the source of emissions while you're idling and helping them get ready for an afternoon of fun or when you're hauling them onto the swim step after they're finished. —Pam Gibson, USPS Compass

Nautical Trivia

"This early work may have included the first 'red sky in the morning, sailor take warning' weather forecast with its verse, "When it is evening, ye say, it will be fair weather for the sky is red. And in the morning it will be foul weather today for the sky is red and lowring". What is the title of the work from which this verse is taken?"

"The two most contrasting colors, black and white, are the predominant pattern of lighthouses on the southern East Coast of the U. S. However, as you move north along the coast, red and white become the favored color patterns. Why?"
