
The dinner buffet followed with delicious salmon, chicken and pasta. The raspberry cheesecake with fresh raspberries was worth the trip.

Vessel Safety Corner

Hello from your new Administrative Officer. By the time you are reading this, warmer weather and boating season will only be a few weeks away! But even during the winter months, we have fun. Thanks to all the people who filled my house for Friday Fun Night in January.

In April, we will have our monthly meeting at the church, and we will enjoy some "old favorite" dishes brought by our members. With the wide variety of dishes that usually show up, there should be something for everyone.

Later in the month, we will have our first Delhigh pub crawl. Although Bethlehem has many good choices for places to visit, we limited our selection to pubs/restaurants on Main Street so you wouldn't have to walk too far. And of course you don't have to visit the pubs if you would just like to join us for dinner at The Brew Works.

In May, we are continuing our "brew" theme by having our monthly meeting at the Two Rivers Brewing Company in Easton. This is a favorite place for some of our members, where there is good food along with a good selection of beers.

Once again it is that time of the year when spring arrives and it is time to take off the shrink-wrap, bottom paint, check your lines, zincs, props and more. By doing 'ALL' the preseason checks and taking the time to correct any issues, you are helping ensure you have a good boating season. It also pays to have a Vessel Safety Check by one of your Vessel Safety Examiners. It would also be a good idea to refer to the regulations and safety tips issued by the U.S. Coast Guard in the <u>USPS.org</u> website, Vessel Safety section. This information is published to keep you informed.

Here is a check list to go over before having a Vessel Safety Check:

- 1. Registration number properly displayed.
- 2. Registration / Documentation
- 3. Personal Flotation
- 4. Visual Distress Signal Devices
- 5. Fire Extinguishers
- 6. Ventilation
- 7. Backfire Flame Control
- 8. Sound Producing Devices /Bell
- 9. Navigation Lights
- 10. Pollution Placard
- 11. MARPOL Trash Placard
- 12. Marine Sanitation Devices
- 13. Navigation Rules
- 14. State and Local Regulations
- 15. Overall Vessel Condition

Upon passing the Vessel Safety Check you will be awarded the 2018 VSC Decal to show that you are in compliance with the regulations.



Boating Safety

Knowing how to use an AFD could save a life



Do you know how to use an <u>automated external defibrillator</u>? One of the easiest pieces of lifesaving equipment around, an AED takes very little knowledge to use. Take a look at the mall, grocery store, restaurant or your marina, and I'll bet you can find one on a wall.

Sudden cardiac death is usually the result of the heart going into an arrhythmia called ventricular fibrillation. The only treatment is to defibrillate the heart so it can reset itself into a normal blood-pumping rhythm. Hence, the use of an AED. With early use of an AED (within 3 to 5 minutes), the person has a 70 percent chance of survival.

Don't be afraid to use an AED. The machine will tell you exactly what to do.

Here's what you should do if someone collapses, doesn't respond and doesn't appear to be breathing:

- If necessary, move the person away from wetness before administering shocks.
- Grab the AED, and turn it on. Have someone else call 911.
- Place the pads on the person's dry, bare chest. The device includes a picture of where to put them. The cables are usually attached to the AED.
- Make sure no one is touching the person. The AED will say "analyzing."

If it says "shock advised," make sure no one is touching the person, yell "clear," and push the shock button. Then continue with <u>CPR</u> until emergency help arrives.

• If it says "no shock advised," perform CPR.

D5 Spring Conference Raffle

Additional incentives to participate in the D/5 Spring Conference Raffle have been added for this year to increase the amount raised. The rules are as follows.

Last year the 50/50 raffle yielded a donation of \$800.00. \$400.00 of this went to the owner of the winning ticket. the other went to the District and the sponsoring squadron to defray costs of the conference. This year I have been challenged to raise the proceeds of the raffle to \$1,000.00.

The rules are that one does not have to be present to win. The winner will be drawn at the banquet on Saturday evening. The winner can be a single person, or a group of people who put up \$5.00 dollars each and split the winnings, or, for example, if the members of a say 50 member squadron each donate \$1.00 in the name of their squadron so that their squadron benefits from the winnings. Any arrangement is possible.

Tickets sales will be as follows:

1 through 4 - \$ 1.00 each

6 tickets - \$ 5.00

12 tickets - \$10.00

25 tickets - \$20.00

50 tickets - \$40.00

75 tickets - \$50.00

100 tickets _ \$75.00

Finally, should I make my challenge of \$1,000.00 several anonymous donors have agreed to donate \$350.00 to the District coffers. This is not part of the 50/50 distribution. If I do not make the \$1,000.00 or more in the 50/50, the District will not receive the \$350.00 donation. I would like to see D5 get the additional money and wish to involve as many members of D/5 as we can.

As an additional incentive a certificate will be given to that squadron whose members donate the most money and to that squadron which donates the most money per capita. For example: a squadron which has 100 members and donates \$100.00 may win the total donation certificate whereas a squadron with 50 members donating \$100.00 would win the second certificate because of a greater per capita donation.
