Fran Montuori, SN is Delhigh Power Squadrons newest member. As a member of Northern New Jersey Sail and Power Squadron since 1964 Fran has been an associate member of Delhigh for many years now, only recently transferring his home squadron to Delhigh. Though Fran originally took Piloting in 1964, his love of Piloting lives on as he helps to teach our new piloting students, including the class that is currently learning.



When Fran was a young man, he had a friend, Noel Otto, whom he helped build a boat from scratch that they called Banshee, which they put a new Chevy Corvette motor on. It had way too much horsepower for the little sixteen-foot boat but the real story is the gas tank, I suggest asking Fran about it some time. He spent so much time working on and riding in Banshee that he joined the power squadron, where he and Diane started taking the basic boating courses. While a member of Northern New Jersey Sail and Power Squadron, Fran took all of his advanced courses and was the Squadron Educational Officer.

Fran began his career with Western Electric Defense Activities Division in December of 1959 working at 120 Broadway in Lower Manhattan in New York City. When that division transferred to North Carolina in 1968 Fran transferred to Bell Laboratories in Whippany, New Jersey. After the SALT treaty with Russia, the US Government cancelled the contract with Western Electric to make the guidance system for the Titan 1 ICBM and Fran was transferred to the Western Electric Plant in Allentown in November, 1973. 



that time, after college, Diane was home raising their three children. 


Holiday Party







Boatyards in winter

Stay safe while checking on your boat in the off-season



Many of us make regular pilgrimages to visit our boats on the hard at local boatyards. *The Melodic* stays in the water all winter on the Branford River, and I spend many hours onboard to assure it (and myself) that warmer sailing days are ahead.

A boatyard in winter is a beautiful experience, and I encourage you to visit your boat. However, the ice and cold can be particularly dangerous near the water, so here are a few things to remember:

- Negotiating an icy ladder to get aboard a boat on the stands can be really tricky. If you are not sure it's safe, spend your time examining your boat's bottom and below-water gear instead.
- Boatyards are usually quiet, abandoned places in winter, and you will most likely be the only one there. If something goes wrong, yelling for help won't cut it. Make sure you have your cell-phone with you, and let someone at home know where you are and when you expect to return.
- If you do venture out on to the docks, you *must* wear a lifejacket. Falling into the drink is not fun at any time, but in winter, hypothermia can make it fatal. There's a small cove on the East River that, given a peculiar combination of eddies and currents, always traps the winter flotsam from western Long Island Sound and the Harlem, Hudson and East rivers. Every year, more than a few bodies are recovered, boaters who slipped off their docks or fell off boats into frigid waters.
- Taking an afternoon snooze aboard a floating boat in winter is one of life's great joys, but anyone who spends time aboard and uses a space heater needs to exercise great caution. If you have a radiant heater that works like a toaster with bright orange filament strips or if your heater stays on when tipped over, donate it to the nearest dump. These heaters are lethal on a boat. It's best to buy a small, inexpensive ceramic or oil-filled radiator for use onboard. Keep in mind that no heater is fully safe, and fire is always a possibility. Keep your fire extinguisher at hand. Find out if your marina bans heaters of any kind. Your insurance won't cover any damage if that's the case.




