Secretary's Message

As you know, we recently held our Founders Day Celebration. I originally wrote this article on our 101st Anniversary. It was read at our 106th Founders' Day celebration on Sunday February 13th. I hope you find it interesting.

101 Years of Friendship and Service 1916-2017

Last year The Delaware River Sail & Power Squadron celebrated its 100th Anniversary. At that time an article was written about the beginnings of the squadron based on a letter that one of our founders, Dr. Eugene Swayne, wrote describing his experiences in 1914 when he sailed from Delaware City, Delaware down the Chesapeake Bay and up to New York Harbor.

He was shocked to realize that many of the boaters that he encountered apparently did not understand "the rules of the road". They had no idea how to navigate safely with the tugs and merchant marine vessels travelling in the harbor. It was this experience that convinced Swayne and Charles F. Chapman to offer classes to yachtsmen so that they would have a better understanding of the "running" of sail and power boats in the waterways and harbors of the U.S.

This was the birth of The United States Power Squadrons and the establishment of The Delaware River Power Squadron in 1916. The book that Chapman wrote, *Piloting*, *Seamanship and Small Boat Handling* has become the bible of amateur seaman in its latest edition to this day.

One of the first instructors was an old whaling ship captain with 35 years experience. He had developed his navigation skills by his instinct and knew little real theory. The classes which were held at 104 S. Juniper Street, Philadelphia, on Tuesday evenings produced real navigators. Many of these men became Merchant Marine captains.

According to the minutes of a meeting of DRPS on February 9, 1917 a resolution was passed to offer the services of the squadron to the United States in the event of war. They promised to "man and operate such motor boats as may be used in defense of the Delaware River, Delaware Bay, and the coasts adjacent there to." At a meeting in May 1917 eleven members volunteered the use of their boats to train men for patrol service.

Through the 101 years of existence of The Delaware River Sail & Power Squadron, lessons have been learned, navigation aids have improved, and friendships made. Our service projects have added to the knowledge of the boating public and the safety of our waterways.



Updated Fire Extinguisher Requirements

The Coast Guard has amended the portable fire extinguishing equipment requirements for recreational vessels that are propelled or controlled by propulsion machinery. This rule does not alter standards for commercial vessels including vessels carrying passengers for hire or have any effect on recreational vessels that do not use propulsion machinery. This rule also moves fire extinguishing equipment rules for recreational vessels from subpart 25.30 (Fire Extinguishing Equipment) of subchapter C (Uninspected Vessels) of title 46 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) to part 175 of subchapter S (Boating Safety) of title 33, where other recreational vessel rules already exist. Fire extinguishers must:

- 1. Be on board and readily accessible;
- 2. Be of an approved type;
- 3. Not be expired or appear to have been previously used; and
- 4. Be maintained in good and serviceable working condition, meaning:
 - If the extinguisher has a pressure gauge reading or indicator it must be in the operable range or position;
 - The lock pin is firmly in place;
 - The discharge nozzle is clean and free of obstruction; and
 - The extinguisher does not show visible signs of significant corrosion or damage.

The rule takes effect on April 20, 2022.



Follow instructions below.

- 1. The Member section provides data from your membership record. See the Registration Instructions document linked below if there are issues.
- 2. Use the tools in the Spouse / Other Attendees section to add other members or guests.
 - a. Select name of an additional member from your squadron. Use the Add Additional Member button to add a select box.
 - b. Use the Add Guest Fields to add controls where you can type the names of other people who will attend.
- 3. Enter the number of entrees of each meal type you wish to purchase. Total cost will be automatically computed.
 - a. Click on the button **Automatically submit form to conference organizers** to save registration to conference database. Changes can be made to your registration as needed, up to the registration deadline of March 8, 2022. Of course, this may change the amount you owe.

From the Galley! Pioneer Womans' Million Dollar Dip



Ingredients

- 1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese, room temperature
- 3/4 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup slivered almonds, toasted
- 1 cup shredded sharp cheddar
- 1 cup shredded Swiss
- 1/4 cup blue cheese crumbles
- 8 slices regular-cut bacon, cooked until crisp and finely chopped
- 4 green onions, sliced, green and white parts
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- Buttery crackers, pretzels or raw veggies, for serving

- Step 1: Toast the almonds
- Step 2: Beat the cream cheese and mayo
- Step 3: Combine the cheeses
- Step 4: Mix the ingredients
- Step 5: Chill and Serve the dip
