In an effort to increase membership involvement, every time a Delhigh active member attends an event listed on our calendar, he or she will receive an entry blank. If your spouse or children over 18 are not Delhigh members you should go on line and

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change your membership to a family membership so they can qualify for our drawing. The drawing will be held next year at the 2012-2013 COW. There will be more detail in the next Delhighlights on this drawing and how you can collect multiple entry blanks, so keep an eye out for it. Right now my assistant, Audrey, will be handing out one raffle ticket, one per ACTIVE MEMBER. Put your name, phone number and COW 2012 on it and you have your first entry for the flat screen TV. Remember it is only for active members, so if you are not an active member of Delhigh just go online and join our squadron and attend more Delhigh events this year. There is nothing to buy just become a member and attend Delhigh events. Entries won't cost anything just participate in events and be a Delhigh member. Like the Mafia, we take care of our own.

Our annual Rendezvous will be held this year in Wildwood, New Jersey in Cape May County. Delhigh Kids Use Time Off the Water To Help Feed The Homeless

We all try to teach our kids to be kind and humble, which is not often easy for them. I found myself one Saturday morning in an even more difficult position as a parent. Cyrus and I were taking the boys and meeting Cam and some members of her women's group for a soup kitchen. The boys had never been to one before. Now we're in the car, Vince is 8, almost 9, and Oliver is 5. I'm trying to explain that the people that they are going to be meeting and serving are just normal people without homes, but how do I do this without scaring them? I want them to treat these people with the respect that they deserve, I mean, in this economy, any of us could wind up jobless. I'm trying to prepare them for what they might be seeing. Explaining that the homeless have no showers to keep clean, no washing machines for their clothes or panties full of food, and no closets to keep their belongings in. Kids are naturally curious, and I've been mortified on more than one occasion by my kids seemingly harmless questions!

I'm happy to say that all went well! We had a great time. The boys helped prepare soup, which is one of Oliver's favorite things at home! They wrapped plastic silverware in napkins, drew pictures for table centerpieces and stacked up the extra bread with a big FREE sign on top.

When it was time to get started they were a little leery about going to the door to greet people, and truth be told, I was a bit worried about what they might decide to say. Cyrus took them anyway and off they went. When most of the people were in and had been served the boys came back inside because they were getting cold. I started to point out that this was not only a warm meal, but an hour out of the cold and wind for the people here, but they were so excited about saying hello to everyone that I never got the chance! I'm not even sure that they noticed that some of these people weren't especially clean or well kept.

Soon the boys were warm and ready to help serve! I'm very glad that they had a good time, because I intend to take them back, but I'm pretty sure that the lesson I intended for them to learn was very much lost on them. In fact I'm not sure that they even realized that these people had less than they do, so I can't imagine that they felt like anything more than good hosts. I hope some day they'll realize that they've been doing this for years and it will make them feel good about themselves, but until then, this was the first day, of hopefully many, that they will enjoy in the company of those that can use a friendly smile and a helping hand.



To help us enjoy them even more, Delhigh is scheduling a full load of education courses for this year. For starters, we have a Boating Safety course at Peters Marine on 3/17 & 3/24 and another one at Peters on 4/14 & 4/21. This course teaches all the basics of boating safely and makes you eligible to receive your Pa Safe Boating Certificate! This course is FREE and comes with a six month free membership to Delhigh! Please folks, now is the time to get your friends who boat with you to get an excellent boating education!

The next course in our line-up is Seamanship and we hope to start that class in late April, possibly on 4/26, date still TBD. For people new to Delhigh, we are offering one year free membership with their \$75 fee for the Seamanship course! There are chapters on marlinspike, the skipper's responsibilities, emergency situations, the marine environment, nautical etiquette, and much more!

It's almost that time of year again, when our shorts and bathing suits are put on, our boats go in the water and the sunscreen stings our eyes, but keep an eye on our calendar and join us if you can, we'd love to have you!

TREASURER Lt/C Gary Corcoran

Delhigh has many events throughout the year, and we strive to make them not only fun, but affordable. We usually try to keep prices for events close to total costs, so that the prices are as low as they can be, without losing money. For example, the Delaware River Education cruise last May was exactly break-even. For the recent Change Of Watch (COW) ceremony/dinner, we actually ended up with a small loss of \$37.53. For the upcoming Iron Pigs baseball game meeting in August, we will only be charging the price of the tickets (which include food).

There have also been exceptions to our breakeven guideline, where Delhigh decided to absorb some of the costs. For the Holiday party this past December, the total cost for the restaurant, DJ, and miscellaneous expenses was over \$75 per person.

Yet we thought that would be prohibitively expensive for most people, so we only charged \$49.95 per person. Delhigh also has no-cost events throughout the year, such as the trailer boat rendezvous, and the Beltsville Lake cleanup.

Of course Delhigh also has expenses throughout the year, for which there is no corresponding event income, such as the monthly charge to provide a phone number for Delhigh on our web site. This phone number is used by people to call to inquire about our boating safety courses, or about joining Delhigh, for example. And there are expenses for postage, the donation for the use of the church facilities for meetings and our education room, etc. Your Delhigh dues help to pay for these expenses and help defray some of the event losses, such as the COW.

Delhigh does have a good safety cushion of money in the bank. We use that cushion to be able to put down required deposits for events, often many months before the events take place. And we often have multiple deposits outstanding at a time. But in order to ensure that we don't end up draining our bank account down towards zero over time, we encourage you to participate in our raffles and other fund raising events!

The Delhigh website is clean looking, meaning that everything is in the proper place. You will be pleased how easy it is to navigate to what you are looking for. Down the right side of the page you have the welcome message, boating education, vessel safety check, squadron boating activities, and the list of contacts.

The welcome message has two links in it. The United States Power Squadron ® District 5the benefits of Membership in USPS, and the name and phone number to contact about joining.

The Boating Education section has a link for basic boating education that can be done on line and advanced course and seminars. The link has a list of all courses that are offered to members and all seminars that are offered to members and non members. The education officer's name and a phone number is here to contact about signing up for courses.

The vessel safety check has a link that has information on safety notices, alerts of faulty equipment, and new procedures for on-line vessel safety checks. There is also a link in the vessel safety check to set up a VSC by entering your zip code. The contact name and phone number is also in this section. The Squadron Boating Activities section has the current issue and 4 past issues of the "Delhighlights". The Squadron Contact has the Bridge Officers and Newsletter Editor list, which are also links to E-mail any of them for information.

The Squadron Activities has 2 lists. The Past Events list has a description and photos that you can see by clicking on the blue highlighted link. The Future Events is a list of up-coming events that you can access by clicking on the blue highlighted link, information such as date, time, cost if any, and special instructions.

There are four Useful Links: The USPS National Website, The D/5 Website, The USPS News, and The Chesapeake Bay Marine Weather. The USPS national Website has a safe boating section and one that tells what the USPS is all about as well as many other links for supplies. The D/5 Website has list of all the squadrons in D/5 and a map of their locations. If you want a Delhigh roster, you would click on the Members Only link located in the upper left corner and enter your certificate number and password. If you have a problem getting into this link, contact the webmaster link at bottom of page. The USPS News is a website that has articles on subjects such as Testing of the Nationwide Emergency Alert System, and other articles involving safe boating. The Chesapeake Bay Marine Weather link is used to check the weather on the Chesapeake Bay. It is divided into sections; find the section you are in and click on the link to get the weather in that section. This is a very handy link.

There is a Sea Vester website for children. It is for both parents and children to educate them on safe boating and rules by way of games and printed information. When you want to know what is planned with Delhigh, this is the website to go to. The website is set up very nicely and is maintained well by Webmaster Bob Hannabery.


