#### **Delhigh Edition**





1<sup>st</sup>/Lt Edward Muschlitz, SN has been a member of Delhigh Power Squadron for 55 years and Eileen has had a Women's Certificate for 20. Ed taught the safe boating course for over 30 years for Delhigh and most recently was the flag lieutenant for all 5 years of both P/C's Nowroozani's years as commander. As a member of Delhigh for so many years, what could there be that we still don't know?

Ed graduated from high school in 1950 and aspired to work at Western Electric but was turned down because he was not yet 18 years old. Ed's first job was with Just Born making 48¢ coating raisins and nuts with chocolate. I don't suggest asking him about the filtering of the chocolate if you ever want to eat chocolate again, but he was so precise separating the raisins, which is not an easy task as anyone who likes raisins knows, that the boss was impressed. The job paid per pound and to the dismay of his fellow workers, he was soon upgraded by the boss to Brazil nuts, which are much heavier than raisins!

Ed served in the army in Germany, then France from 1953-1954. He was a stock record specialist but claims his real job and talent was table tennis. He had the opportunity to

play quite often and became very good. This job also allowed him a Class A Pass, which meant that he could leave the base whenever he felt like it, which was not the case for many of his friends. It allowed him to leave the base to buy alcohol for his fellow soldiers. On one of his first few trips he went into town and sat at a table for a drink first. He happened to invite some French soldiers over for a drink and made some friends, even though he had not learned any French and they spoke no English. When the waitress went to take his money from the table the French soldier yelled at her, and she put 80% of Ed's money back. As it turns out there were 3 prices for everything, one for the Americans, which was the highest, one for the French public, which was lower, and one for the French soldiers, which was the cheapest cost as they were paid such low wages. After that Ed would meet with the French soldiers whenever he went in to purchase alcohol for his friends. His friends would give him the American cost for the alcohol, so Ed and his French friends would drink

all day, buy the alcohol to bring back to his friends, and there would still be money left over! As time went by Ed was taking French lessons with the Army and he was better able to communicate with the French soldiers, but free alcohol seems to be a universal sign of friendship!

After the army Ed came home and went back to work for Western Electric, where he had started when he was 18. At Western Electric Ed worked for many years at an inspector of products. Eileen also worked at Western Electric as a file clerk until she was rewarded for her outstanding work and became the secretary for a big wig.

How their first date happened is a story with two sides, like any good story, so I hope you will ask each of them and hear for yourself. They were married in 1956 and Eileen stopped working to start a family. Several years after their girls were born Eileen went back to work at Holy Trinity Church where we have our meetings. She worked there for 5 years, then at a bank for 15 years and back to Holy Trinity for 5 more years.

Ed remains active in the community since retiring. He volunteers much of his time to Miller Keystone Blood Center and has himself donated more than 75 gallons of blood. He was recognized in 2005 by the Northampton County Area Agency on Aging as an Outstanding Senior Volunteer. He continues to donate his time to wonderful organizations and is an inspiration to us all, especially when in comes to civic service and friendliness.

Ed joined Delhigh in 1964, women were not yet allowed to be members. Ed and Eileen were friends with the very first commander of Delhigh, P/C Earl W. Harpel, SN. When Earl got sick he was looking for someone to buy his cabin on lake Wallenpaupack and his boat. As it turns out, Eileen had always wanted a cabin and Ed had always wanted a boat, and Earl gave them a deal they could not refuse. The only stipulation was that they both had to pass the ABC course and Ed had to join Delhigh. They did pass, and join Delhigh and although Eileen got a better grade in the course, only Ed went on to become an SN because Eileen would not have gotten credit for the courses she took, as she was not allowed to become For over 15 years Ed and Eileen hosted Delhigh's Fall Rendezvous at their cabin. A few years there were around 150 members in attendance. They started serving a bone soup, which became a nice potluck with other members bringing things to add to the soup. For some reason it seems that P/C Brent Rhoads. SN kept getting the bone instead of soup in his bowl, but I'm sure that was just a coincidence...!

# A History of Prince Henry





#### Prince Henry the Navigator

In the early 15<sup>th</sup> century Prince Henry started a school of navigation in Sagres, Portugal to advance the science of navigation. Prince Henry, like other European mariners, wanted to find an alternative to the passage to the lucrative trade in the Orient. The obvious passage was through the Mediterranean, but hostile Islamic powers and the equally hostile Venetian empire made it difficult to follow this route. So Henry proposed to go south around Africa to reach the Orient. A minor problem however was that in those days the coast of Africa had not been charted and no one knew how far south the African continent extended. Unlike other navigators of the day, such as the Vikings and Spaniards that basically sailed east and west, the Portuguese needed to sail south if they were to round the tip of Africa. To do this they needed to be able to find their position through Celestial Navigation. As a result much advancement in Celestial Navigation took place. Henry began to send Portugue se sailors south to chart the coast of Africa. These sailors came back to Portugal and increased the data base at the Prince Henry School of Navigation. Henry did not live long enough to see his dream accomplished. He died in 1468 and the Portuguese did not reach the tip of Africa until 1488. <sup>2</sup>

In the early 1960s the government of Portugal, at the embassy in Washington D.C., discussed creating an award in honor of Prince Henry the Navigator commemorating the 500<sup>th</sup> year of his death. In 1965, P/R/C James D. Paris, SN, then commander of District 4, was approached by the Portuguese agency in New York. Ultimately the Portuguese government awarded an alabaster replica of Prince Henry to each of the Districts of USPS. After presenting the Award to District 4, Commander Jose Cabral, representing the Portuguese government, accompanied Jim to present the award to 20 USPS districts at their conferences. The deed of gift gave each district the authority to establish its own criteria for earning the award.

In 1965, Jim Paris led an expedition of 65 members and their wives to the Prince Henry School of Navigation in Sagres, Portugal. While there, the government made Jim a commander in the order of Prince Henry the Navigator. The secretary of the Navy placed a gold cross with a colorful ribbon around Jim's neck. For many years, Jim entertained the winners of the previous year's award at a luncheon at the Portuguese Embassy in Washington, DC. In 1985 Jim led another group of 200 USPS members to the Portuguese School of Navigation where they were received by the President of Portugal. Jim was presented with a swallow tailed Ensign® for his meritorious service to USPS.<sup>3</sup>


# **Safety**


It's that time of year again when we must be aware of the water temperature when going out on the water. Cold water immersion is a very real safety concern, so much so that in the state of Pennsylvania in boats less than 16 feet life jackets are required by law between 1 November and 30 April.

Did you know that cold water lowers body temperature 25 times faster than cold air? This is why wearing your PFD is critical to staying in the HELP position to conserve energy and heat. Always get out of the water as soon as you can, even if you are just climbing on top of your capsized boat and shivering. Always seek medical attention after possible hypothermia, even once you are out of the water you can be at risk.
