Have a safe boating summer.



As boaters we enjoy our time on the water for a multitude of reasons. For some it is time with family and friends, for others it is the sense of community at the marina or on the water. There is also fishing, skiing and tubing, and sightseeing. Chances are it is a combination of the list above that drives our love for being out on the water.

My former neighbor Suresh, who now lives in Taiwan, was back in PA for business and stopped by for a visit in April. His in-laws would spend six months out of the year with them in PA and six months in India. Suresh stops by whenever he is in town, this time with a pleasant surprise.

His father in-law Mallikarjunan had written and published his personal memoirs and wanted to give me a copy. In his collection of insights, memories and life experiences, he wrote a poem about his experience on our boat Last Call. I was taken back with the fact that this man reflecting on over eight decades was impacted enough by a boat ride to not only include them in his collection, as write a poem about the experience.

In 2010 our family took Suresh's father in law Mallikarjunam and his wife Jayalakshmi to Delhigh's Beltsville cleanup. After collecting debris along the shore we opened Last Call's engine across the lake, which was like glass due to rain earlier in the day discouraging boaters from coming out.

After getting on plane we cruised at 30 knots for several laps around the lake, from the dam to the no-wake zone and back several times. The sky had cleared and the open bow was the perfect place for our guest to enjoy the ride. We would have kept going if we did not have lunch reservations for after the lake cleanup.

About a week later I remember Suresh telling me that his in-laws had a great time on the boat and that Mallikarjunam was going to write a poem about it. I thought to myself that is impressive that he was going to convert his boating experience to prose. That was 2010, I finally had the opportunity to read it in 2018. Personally, it was very impactful and reminded me about the opportunity we have as boaters to create memories and life experiences for and with others. Hopefully the poem on this page will inspire you to bring a new person onboard this season, or remind you of the first time on your or someone else's boat.

Thank you Suresh for hand delivering the book, and thank you Mallikarjunam for sharing your life experience and perspective. I have always had a love for boating, your refection has made me appreciate boating that much more.

Over the past two months I have had the opportunity to go to a few marinas along the Chesapeake and Potomac River and saw many boats still shrink wrapped on stands waiting to be brought back to life for this boating season. Everyone should have started to enjoy the boating season, but because of variable weather conditions..... you know the rest. Hopefully the weather will soon get better, dryer, and warmer so the real boating season can begin.

While you were getting your boat ready for the first run of the season, we hope you paid attention to the items needed to pass a Vessel Safety Check.

Your Vessel Safety Examiners mission is to bring everyone into compliance with state and federal regulations by educating the public. By having your vessel inspected, passing, receiving and displaying the VSC Decal you are showing law enforcement that you are in compliance.

Please go to the <u>USPS.org</u> website, log in, go to the Vessel Safety Site and read about some of the updates and relook at the items needed to pass a VSC or if you have a VSC form from last years inspection look it over to see if you need to correct anything.

If you or someone you know has a boat and feels ready to have a VSC, please contact one of our Vessel Safety Examiners, there is contact information at <u>Delhigh.org</u>.

We have also added a VSC date on June 9 to our schedule of events at Beltzville Park for anyone who still needs a check and is looking for a day out on their boat. See the calendar for details.



2018 Youth Poster Contest Sponsored by the National Membership Committee (New Contest Period: Contest ends August 17, 2018)

The USPS Youth Poster Contest Awards promote youth appreciation and respect for recreational boating, and the message that safe boating is always fun boating.

The Contest is open to children ages 6-14, which is divided into three age groups:

1) Ages 6 - 8 2) Ages 9 - 11 3) Ages 12 - 14

Squadrons should conduct local contests and submit winning posters to their respective District for judging. Posters submitted to the National Membership Committee for judging must be endorsed by each District Poster/Membership Chair as the point of contact.

The 2018 Poster Theme:

"America's Boating Club Saves Lives"

Artwork should illustrate how safe boating through education, on the water skills, and proper use of equipment save lives.

Rules

- Each district may submit one poster in each age category.
- Each entry must be submitted on poster board or heavy construction paper; size 15"x20" or 14"x22"
- Entries must be judged at the district level to select winning entries for submission at the National contest level.
- Squadron and District judging deadlines are a local decision.
- Only District First-Place winners in each age category will be accepted for judging at the National level.
- Posters may be sketched lightly with pencil, but the result must be in color suitable for photography.
- Professional illustrations, photos, copyrighted or trademark material, purchased or computer generated are not allowed and will disqualify the entry.
- Posters must not to be folded.
- · Posters will be judged on the Theme, message and artistic representation.
- Only one entry per person is allowed. All entries become the property of the United States Power Squadrons, which reserves the right to display and reproduce.
- Contest entry forms must be complete, legible, and attached to the back of their poster.
- Annual Contest entries must now be delivered to the Fall Governing Board Meeting. This year's meeting
 will be held in Minneapolis, MN. Posters must be received by Friday, 17 August 2018, for judging.
- First, Second and Third Place Winners will be announced for each age category during the Minneapolis Meeting. Awards are underwritten by a grant from the OMC Foundation.



Boating Safety

A life jacket primer



Choosing the perfect life jacket

Federal and state regulations require that recreational boats carry a minimum of one readily accessible wearable life jacket of the proper type and size in serviceable condition for each person on board. Boats over 16 feet long must also carry an immediately accessible throwable flotation aid.

Nine out of 10 drownings occur in inland waters, most within a few feet of safety. Most of the victims owned life jackets but died without them. A life jacket can save your life if you wear it.

Get the right size lifejacket

Most adults only need an extra 7 to 12 pounds of buoyancy to keep their heads above water. A life jacket gives you that extra lift, and it's made to keep you floating until help comes. It's important to get the right size personal flotation device.

Your weight isn't the only factor in finding out how much extra lift you need in water. Body fat, lung size, clothing and whether the water is rough or calm, all play a part. Read the label on your life jacket to make sure it's made for someone your weight and size.

Try on and test out your life jacket

Try on your life jacket to see if it fits comfortably snug. Then test it in shallow water to see how it handles.

To check the buoyancy in the water, relax your body and let your head fall back. Make sure your life jacket keeps your chin above water and you can breathe easily.

Be aware: Your life jacket may not act the same in swift or rough water as in calm water. The clothes you wear and the items in your pockets may also change the way it works. If your mouth is not well above the water, get a new lifejacket with more buoyancy.

Before you shove off, make sure everyone on board is wearing a life jacket with all straps, zippers and ties fastened. Tuck in any loose strap ends to avoid getting hung-up.

Caring for your life jacket

- 1. Don't alter your life jacket. If yours doesn't fit, get one that does.
- 2. Don't put heavy objects on your life jacket or use it as a kneeling pad or boat fender. They lose buoyancy when crushed.
- 3. Let your life jacket drip dry thoroughly before stowing it in a well-ventilated place.
- 4. Don't leave it on board for long periods when the boat isn't in use.
- 5. Never dry your life jacket on a radiator, heater or other direct heat source.
- 6. Put your name on it if you're the only wearer.
- 7. Practice throwing your Type IV personal flotation device. Cushions throw best underhanded.
