



This is the perfect time to get out last year's VSC form and check all the items on the list to make sure everything is in working order. As part of the preparation and cleanup, we need to pay attention to safety items. Have your flares expired? Are your fire extinguishers properly charged and within the mfg. date of compliance? Do your lights work properly? What condition are your life jackets in? Do you have the necessary documentation and regulations aboard for each state you go boating?

Our squadron has several certified Vessel Safety Examiners who are qualified to examine your boat to ensure compliance of State and Federal Regulations as set by the U.S. Coast Guard safety requirements, as well as for additional safe boating suggestions. These vessel safety checks are free of charge and permit you to correct any discrepancies and then obtain both a certificate of successful examination and a decal for your boat as evidence of your compliance. If you or any boaters you know would like to have a VSC please contact: Vessel Safety Chairman P/C Michael Lebeduik, III, JN at (610)730-2798. He will assign the closest certified examiner to you to conduct the vessel safety check.

Delhigh's Beltzville Lake Clean Up was originally scheduled for 18 May, during National Safe Boating Week, but had to be rescheduled to 1 June, due to a scheduling conflict at the lake. We will meet 1 June 0900 at the Main Launch Ramp where gloves, bags and other items will be given out to complete our clean up task. Want a boat ride or a walk along the shoreline? Just show up!! Members of Delhigh Squadron will have their boats there also to do clean up from the water. Delhigh members feel free to bring a friend for the day and have some fun, ABC students feel free to join us as well. Afterwards we will meet at Joey B's in Palmerton for good food, friendship and possibly an adult beverage after a long day outdoors cleaning up the area. Your VSE's will be conducting Vessel Safety Checks at the Main Ramp for the public boating on the lake 1 June as well. Come join your Squadron, meet new people and enjoy the day. Heart attack at sea

What to do when you're having a heart attack



Picture this: You're on your boat. You're alone. You start to experience a heart attack. What do you do?

First, did you know that heart attack symptoms differ in men and women? Signs of a heart attack in women

- Disturbed sleep and extreme fatigue. Women report feeling as if they have the flu or are unusually tired up to a month before a heart attack, with no accompanying chest pain in this early time period.
- Chest pain or discomfort. Women sometimes describe discomfort as "pressure," "fullness" or "heartburn."
- Pain or discomfort in the arms, back, neck or stomach
- Cold, clammy sweat
- Shortness of breath or feelings of breathlessness, especially when you haven't been exercising
- Nausea and vomiting
- Dizziness or lightheadedness Signs of a heart attack in men
- Chest pain or discomfort
- Severe sensation of chest pressure
- Pain or discomfort in the arms, back, neck or stomach
- Cold, clammy sweat
- Shortness of breath or feelings of breathlessness, especially when you haven't been exercising
- Nausea and vomiting
- Dizziness or lightheadedness
 So what can you do if you're alone on your boat when you start having a heart attack?
- Remain calm.
- Carry a bottle of aspirin. Chewing one aspirin tablet will not cure a heart attack or make symptoms go away, but it may help slow or reduce clotting and blockage around the site of a ruptured plaque. According to Bayer Healthcare USA, while all aspirin products have a slight acidic, vinegary smell, if it stings your nose it might not be as effective. Check the expiration date. Unless you've had an allergic reaction in the past, a low dosage (75-325 mg) is recommended, but it's important to ask your doctor whether or not you should even be taking aspirin.
- A reduction in effort is essential, i.e., don't try to sail home, drive to a hospital, etc.
- Always carry a VHF radio (or a cellphone if that is practical) so you can radio for help immediately.
- Note the time. This can help the doctors when they treat you.
- Take a CPR class. You might not be able to use it on yourself, but you might be able to save someone else's life.


