





Delhigh has successfully helped our communities in the past and we continue to do our best. Out of the 11 families we were helping 9 families have now found jobs, overcome medical issues or have moved out of state to GA, NJ, or NC to be with family and are now employed and productive.

Every one of these families have expressed their thanks and gratitude for Delhigh being there for them in their time of extreme need.


We have continued to help other organizations including food banks and soup kitchens whom are also very grateful.

We continue to help 2 families and hopefully a few more families in need will be directed our way.

The first 6 months of 2021 have been difficult. To date we have delivered:

864 loaves of bread, 36 dozen eggs, 5/10lb. boxes of hot dogs, 5/10lb. boxes of hamburgers, 20/half gallons of orange juice, 30/gallons of milk, 180 various vegetable canned goods, 40 boxes of various cereal and numerous paper products. We have also contributed clothing, hygiene products, soap, deodorant, toothpaste and brushes, along with cleaning products for kitchen, laundry and bathroom.

Delhigh would like to thank those who have contributed items, clothing, money and their time to make this all possible.







I would like to thank all of Delhigh's Vessel Safety Examiners for continuing and for completing the mandatory workshop put out by the United States Coast Guard. All our VE's are now in compliance and are recertified and they completed the workshop 4 weeks ahead of the scheduled deadline.


This has been a very trying year for all the VSE's for both ABC and the USCG Aux. We worked together at the Beltsville Clean-Up and got the same response from most of the boaters, "Not today. We want to get on the water." Many of the boat owners we did approach and were willing to take a few minutes failed for various reasons. The most common reasons were not having current registration, out of date distress signals, lights not working and a few other reasons. Though not asked for, some of the excuses offered were very creative.

Although we did our best to inform the public, the beautiful day, calm water and lake opening up for the season were the priority of most. We will continue to set up at different locations to keep the public in compliance.

Once again, I want to thank our six VE's for giving of their time to help make our waterways safer.








