# Delhigh Helping Community in 2020

Covid19 has negatively impacted our communities, and for most, our way of life. However, let us take a moment to focus on how it has brought some communities together through the act of helping one another. Some of those less fortunate and going through hard times are being recognized and helped by those with the time and resources to give. Delhigh started helping eleven families put food on the table at the end of 2019 not knowing what 2020 had in store for us.

All of those families fell on unprecedented hard times through no fault of their own. We branched out to do our best to help the community and we found ourselves helping more than those 11 families.

Here is an account of what Delhigh has distributed in 2020 to the Men and Women's Hoga Crea in Allentown and Bethlehem, the West Bethlehem Emergency Food Pantry, the Trinity Episcopal Church 'Soup Kitchen' (which feeds approximately 100 to 175 homeless and struggling individuals every day Monday through Friday), West Bethany Food Bank, the Allentown Mission, the 11 families and the homeless:

3621 loaves of bread and rolls	41 – 3.5 lb. pork loins
36 – 10 /12lb. semi-boneless hams	87 – dozen eggs
200 lbs. potatoes	68 lbs. onions
82 gallons of milk	54 – 64oz. bottles of juice
97 cases of cereal, canned vegetables (corn, peas, carrots, etc.), cases of paper towels and toilet paper and more.	

We have received letters of thanks from many and still the looks on the families faces and the hugs by their children say it all.

Delhigh would like to thank Aldi's and Sam's Club along with all the individuals who gave donations and those who gave their time to deliver food and supplies to make this all possible.

This has been a very humbling experience. We will continue to serve community in 2021.

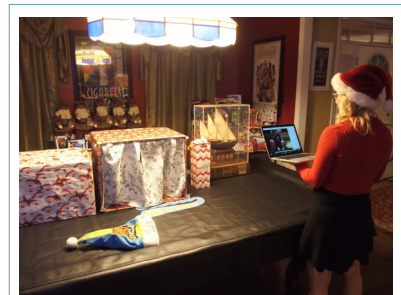

VSC Safety Corner

So far we have been very lucky (don't say that too loud) this winter with the amount of snow and bad weather. We have had our extremely cold and windy days but we are not out of the woods yet.

Now is the time for us to think about what needs to be done to come into compliance with the Federal and State Regulations so our launch into the boating season is smooth.

Your vessel safety examiners have the new 2021 decals and are ready to start the vessel safety check process. When you are ready contact one of the VE's to conduct a free VSC.

If you had a VSC in 2020 look at the form you signed to see if there is anything needed for you to do to receive a decal this year. You can also go to [USPS.org](https://www.usps.org) for a checklist of those items. The [member website](#) also brings you up to date on current recalls, safety items and much more.

With a few weeks to go until the shrink wrap comes off it is a good time to take an online [course](#) to brush up on your skills or learn new ones.

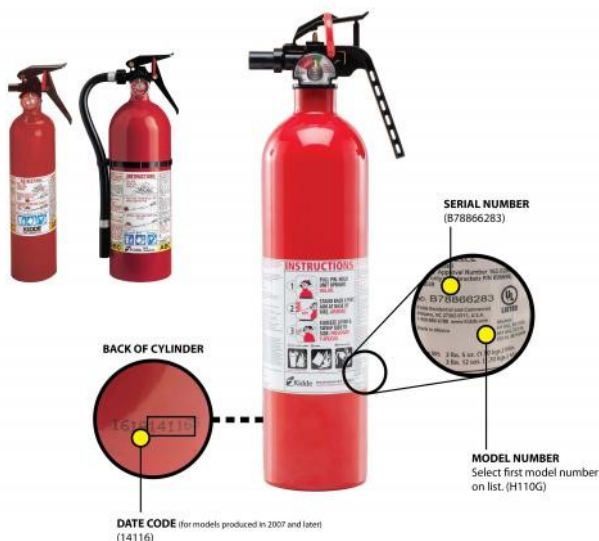

# Prevent carbon monoxide poisoning

Odorless, colorless and tasteless, carbon monoxide gas is often called the “silent killer” because it effectively blocks oxygen delivery to the body, causing a startling number of [fatalities each year](#). Carbon monoxide poisoning deaths can also happen aboard your vessel. Learning how to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning will help keep you safe on the water year round.

Boat engines, cabin heaters, generators and galley stoves can all produce carbon monoxide, with engine and generator exhaust being the most prevalent source. CO fumes can also accumulate in areas away from the exhaust source.

In the absence of a breeze, high CO levels can cause unconsciousness in minutes. Without a carbon monoxide detector onboard, CO is often impossible to detect before it overcomes a victim, who is then too weak to escape or summon help.

## Early symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning

The symptoms of mild CO poisoning can mimic seasickness, colds and flu:

- Nausea, weakness, dizziness or headache
- Ringing ears and watering eyes
- Cherry-red coloring to the skin

Moderate carbon monoxide poisoning can cause

- Lightheadedness or headache
- Drowsiness
- Unconsciousness
- Death

Severe CO poisoning can result in damage to the brain or heart followed by death.

## How to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning on your boat

Prevent CO buildup by regularly checking for leaks in your engine and generator exhaust systems and in the seals around your hatches and portholes. Take the following precautions:

- Check the ventilation of your alcohol stove.
- Maintain your generators meticulously.
- Run your exhaust blowers while using generators.
- Ensure that air flows freely from front to back on a moving boat; avoid the station wagon effect.
- Keep passengers clear of the platform over engine or generator exhaust when running unless there's a strong airflow.
- Be cautious about running engines or generators when anchored, moored, or docked unless there's a substantial breeze; do not run generators overnight when stopped.
- Don't allow anyone in the water to approach within 10 to 20 feet of the engines or generator exhaust.
- Don't tow anyone close to the boat while underway.
- Check stove and other fuel burning device vents for leaks; keep vents clear.
- Beware of nearby boats with engines or generators running; stay clear or move away.

Install CO alarms in your boat's cockpit, cabin and sleeping areas, and test the alarms regularly. If you already have a CO detector installed, it might be time to [update it to a newer model](#).
