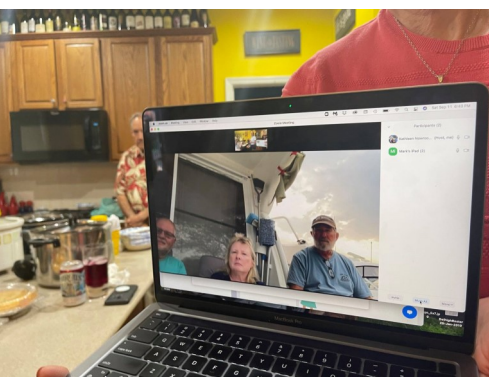

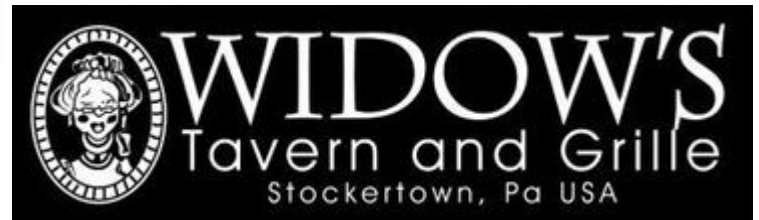

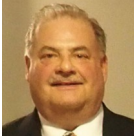

ABC Lehigh Valley's 'Loopers'

Ahoy Matey's! So much has happened since we last checked in with you. We picked up Kathy's uncle in Atlantic Highlands, NJ, and traveled up the Hudson River with him. Seeing the Statue of Liberty up close is always a thrill, no matter how many times we've been by her! The Hudson River is really beautiful once you get past NYC. Great little towns, too many to name, but all filled with history and friendly people. Uncle Wally stayed with us up the Hudson and into the Erie Canal, then he went home and we continued on.

The Erie Canal was an awesome experience. We stopped in 10 towns along the way, went through 34 locks, and thoroughly enjoyed it! We stayed at several free walls and some marinas along the way. The western end of the Erie Canal has low bridges and I had to take down my radar and bimini to get under them. Yes, I was singing the "Low Bridge" song all the way! We met loopers on the Erie Canal that we are still in touch with and are traveling with as much as possible.

The Erie Canal empties into the Niagara River, which takes us into Lake Erie. Our first night we stayed in Buffalo, then on to Dunkirk, Erie, Geneva, Cleveland, Lorain and Port Clinton. The lake treated us well. We waited for weather a few times but when we traveled, the lake was calm.

From there we crossed Lake Erie into the Detroit River and spent the night in Detroit. Then we were into Lake Huron and starting our trip around Michigan. Michigan has so many beautiful small towns and really friendly people! Michigan has been a real highlight of the trip so far! Especially Alpena

where Mark and Mary caught up with us! We've been traveling with them for a few weeks now and what a blessing it is having them with us! We stayed in Macinaw City for 8 days and took the ferry to Macinaw Island. A great trip but we stayed so long because I was waiting on a new heat exchanger for my Stb engine. Part of living on a boat. A big THANK YOU to Mark for knowing how to switch out the parts! Heading south on Lake Michigan in September is challenging. Prepare your boat for rough weather

As a boater, you need to know how to prepare your boat for rough weather well before you see signs of an approaching storm.

Recognize the signs of rough weather

Signs of approaching rough weather include a falling barometer, a swift change in wind speed or direction, waves coming from a new direction, a mass of dark clouds in the west, and fierce lightning. Of course, you'll also be listening for radio or internet warnings.



Preparing your boat for rough weather

If you're underway offshore, sail away from the storm, especially the "dangerous quadrant" on the storm's right front (left front in Southern Hemisphere). To predict the path of a low-pressure storm system, use Buys-Ballot's law: When you face the wind in the Northern Hemisphere, low pressure is on your right and high pressure is on your left. (This is because wind circulates counterclockwise around a Northern Hemisphere low. The low will be on your left in the Southern Hemisphere, where wind circulates clockwise around a low.)

In the Northern Hemisphere, keep the wind on your starboard side to sail away from the approaching storm except when the wind is south to southwest.

To prepare the boat and crew

1. Check the fuel. Make sure your tank is full before leaving.
2. Shorten the sail.
3. Suit up. Everybody should put on foul-weather gear, life jackets and safety harnesses, which must always be hooked on deck. Rig grab lines in the cockpit and cabin. Take seasickness medication.
4. Shut and bolt down hatches and posts, and install washboards in the companionway. Take loose gear off the deck. Put protective panels on large windows to keep them from breaking. Below, secure food and other items in lockers. While the boat's steady, make some hot food and hot water to put in thermoses.

If you're underway with squalls near shore, follow the steps above. When black clouds appear and sweep your way, expect a squall. After plotting your position, decide if you have time to return to harbor. (To estimate the distance to a squall in miles, time the interval between the flash of lightning and sound of the thunderclap, and divide by 5.) Because squalls are unpredictable, it's often safest to stay in open water well away from land, shoals and other boats.

If your boat is in harbor, take the following steps to prepare your boat.

1. Reduce windage. Any exposed area makes the boat sail around its anchor or dock lines, so strip off everything, including all sails, the Bimini top and ventilators. Deflate the dinghy and put it in the cockpit. A hard-bottomed dinghy should be sunk or stored ashore.
2. At the dock, double or even triple up on dock lines, using plenty of spring lines. Tie leather or cloth chafe protection over lines and fittings. Deploy all your fenders. Tie plastic milk bottles full of water to the bottom of fenders to keep them from riding up.
3. Set out all your anchors with plenty of scope.
4. Close all seacocks and other through-hull fittings.
