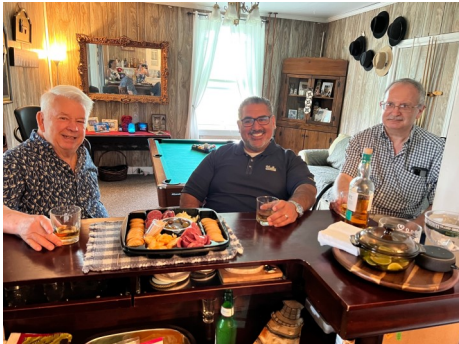

VSC Corner

The boating season has begun and we hope everyone has prepared their boats for a great time on the water. Remember to check your fire extinguishers for charge and age. After they reach 12 years or older, you must replace them even if the charge is still good. New extinguishers must be Coast Guard approved and labeled B5, B10, or B20. Sizes are determined by the size of your boat, the sleeping quarters, and if you have a galley.

To date, we have completed 18 Vessel Safety checks, 17 of which were done at our Beltzville Clean Up on Saturday May 21, 2022. The Coast Guard Auxiliary was also there doing Vessel Safety Checks.

Thank you to all our Vessel Safety Examiners for doing a great job. I know there are more VSC's that will be done and some that I have missed, and I will be sure to keep everyone informed.

If you or anyone you know would like to have a vessel check, please call to let us know.



USPS NATIONAL NEWS

So, what's going on with USPS "America's Boating Club"?

The current reorganization efforts of the United States Power Squadrons/America's Boating Club are to focus on the needs of individual members and their local clubs.

After months of study and hearing concerns from USPS/ABC members nationwide, several recommendations were presented to the Chief Commander and the Board of Directors in January, according to Allan Bombard, a member of the reorganization committee. The recommendations are that USPS/ABC should:

- focus on serving the squadrons/clubs and members above all else.
- encourage clubs to critically assess the value that all aspects of the organization bring to their local operation, include in the value of Districts.
- ensure clubs are given a voice (and more votes) in determining their future.

These recommendations are the result of reorganization discussions that began during the 2021 Virtual Annual Meeting, Bombard said. Later that year, the BOD asked V/C Craig Fraser, SN, the then National Executive Officer, to evaluate several trends negatively affecting the organization. V/C Fraser recruited a geographically diverse group of members to evaluate the creation of regions out of the current Districts.

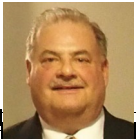
This year, the original reorganization group was enlarged and redesignated the Ad Hoc Committee on Reorganization and placed under the leadership of Paul Mermelstein, SN, and Miles Gee, SN. The BOD also directed the national Planning Committee to further evaluate districts, he said.

Since its organization, the ad hoc committee has been working to supplement member input with two live virtual townhall meetings. Most of the national committees have been engaged in simplifying many of their chartered activities to improve and deliver services directly to the clubs and members, according to Bombard.

The committee has also identified areas to improve the organization's capacity to offer greater service to its members. The areas are: Communication, Marketing, Boating & Social, and Education. The committee is seeking member volunteers to assist with the simplification and updating of these endeavors. Anyone interested in helping should contact Myles Gee at MKGee@MSN.com.

Keep your marine fuel tank full

We've all heard it's a good idea to keep our marine fuel tanks full, but do you know the reason why?

A large quantity of fuel acts as a heat sink, which means the fuel takes a long time to heat or cool enough to match the ambient temperature. While the outside temperature might vary 20 or more degrees daily, the fuel temperature might only vary three to five degrees.

Air taking up unused space in your tank expands and contracts with the temperature change, pushing out through the vent as the day warms and pulling outside air back in overnight as the temperature cools. When this happens, the ambient air entering the tank touches the walls; any moisture in this air condenses onto tank walls and drips into the fuel.

Warm air holds more moisture than cold air. Your fuel is almost always colder than the outside temperature, so any air drawn into the tank contains more moisture than it can hold inside the tank. That extra moisture ends up in your fuel. Boat engines don't run well on water, and removing it can be a problem.

The easy solution is to keep the [fuel tank](#) full, leaving little space for air to go in or out and little tank surface for condensation to accumulate. If your boat uses ethanol-blended fuel, moisture combines with the ethanol and becomes a mess in the bottom of your tank. The current wisdom is to drain the tank for the winter when using ethanol-blended fuel. —Ron Micjan

How to maintain your bilge pump

Avoid the misery of having your boat [sink](#) at the dock or while underway; maintain your bilge pump regularly.

Instead of quoting statistics about bilge pump failure and describing their complexity, I want readers to be aware of a few facts that will help keep water outside of the hull where it belongs.

Bilge pumps are more complicated than most of us realize. They can be overly sensitive to the float, which controls the pump's turning on and off, and many expensive pumps have resets and sensors that can cause the pumps to accidentally stay off when they are most needed. Test them daily to be sure they are working properly and check the hoses to confirm that water is being pumped outside the hull.

Regular inspection is key. It's amazing what finds its way to the bilge, and all those bits and pieces can easily lodge themselves around the pump intake or against the float, preventing it from moving and telling the pump to turn on. Many a boat has sunk with a working pump that didn't activate because the float was mired in debris.

From my experience, bilge pumps don't last long. I have three in *Melodic*, and every year, I replace at least one of them. Why they stop working properly is anyone's guess. All I know is that the cost of a new pump is nothing compared to the cost of repairing a boat sunk at the dock.

Most bilge pumps are located midships in the lowest part of the hull, but since water also accumulates in the bow and stern, a three-pump system provides real safety benefits. Position your pumps where they are most needed.

Lastly, keep a manual, non-electric bilge pump onboard in case you lose electrical power while taking on water. In a tight situation, an inexpensive hand pump could keep you afloat until help arrives. —Daniel S. Fannon

Operation Dry Water, National Boating Under the Influence Prevention Campaign, Releases 2021 Annual Report

Operation Dry Water (ODW) is a year-round boating under the influence awareness and enforcement campaign. The National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA) recently published the 2021 Operation Dry Water Annual Report. This report includes more details on the enforcement results, an overview of the campaign's media exposure and highlights from the 2021 weekend.

More than 600 impaired operators were removed from the nation's waterways over the 2021 [Operation Dry Water](#) heightened boating under the influence (BUI) awareness and enforcement weekend. Over the course of the campaign's three-day weekend, July 2 – 4, more than 7,500

law enforcement officers from over 550 local, state and federal law enforcement agencies were on patrol as part of the Operation Dry Water (ODW) initiative.

With an increased public presence on the water, law enforcement officers were able to make a record number of contacts with the boating public. Officers made contact with over 325,000 recreational boaters while patrolling the nation's waterways, providing an opportunity for officers to educate boaters and help increase awareness about the dangers related to boating under the influence and other boating safety hazards.

The [National Association of State Boating Law Administrators \(NASBLA\)](#) recently published the [2021 Operation Dry Water Annual Report](#). This report includes additional details on the enforcement results, the campaign's media exposure, and highlights from the 2021 weekend. The annual report also features the campaign's awareness and outreach efforts, in addition to an overview of the 2021 Operation Dry Water national awards recipients.

Operation Dry Water is a year-round boating under the influence awareness and enforcement campaign. The annual three-day heightened awareness and enforcement weekend takes place around July 4th, a holiday unfortunately known for drinking and boating, and deadly incidents. Alcohol use is the leading known contributing factor in recreational boater deaths, and a leading factor in recreational boating incidents.* Operation Dry Water reminds boaters that boating while impaired by alcohol or other drugs is extremely dangerous for both operators and passengers.

In 2022, the Operation Dry Water weekend will be taking place nationwide July 2 - 4, 2022 (Saturday, Sunday and Monday) to align with the 4th of July which falls on a Monday.

The [National Association of State Boating Law Administrators \(NASBLA\)](#) coordinates the Operation Dry Water campaign, in partnership with law enforcement agencies and outreach partners nationwide, through a grant from the Sport Fish Restoration and Boating Trust Fund administered by the U.S. Coast Guard.

[Operation Dry Water \(ODW\)](#) is a year-round boating under the influence awareness and enforcement campaign with the mission of reducing the number of alcohol and drug-related incidents and fatalities through increased recreational boater awareness and by fostering a stronger and more visible deterrent to alcohol and drug use on the water.
