



VSC Corner

With the mild winter we have had, boaters are beginning to get anxious to get their boats ready for another season to be on the water. As you ponder this, make a list of things you need to do and get the supplies and parts necessary for a good and safe time this year.

Check your hoses and connections for cracks, leaks and hardening, such as fuel, water and air intakes. Blower motors that are not running at proper speed means not enough air flow, putting strain on electrical systems, which can overheat and cause fire. The bilge should be cleaned, and the pump checked, with all debris cleaned from around it. The exit hose should be completely open. If your boat is equipped with a fire suppression system, check that it is charged and outlets are open.

Check your steering to be sure it is free and turns properly in both directions. Outboard motors need to be greased at all fittings with the correct grease for durability and ecological protection. Check the throttle cables for wear and worn-out casings. Electrical systems should be checked for loose connections, frayed insulation and broken wires.

Tune up your motors, including spark plugs and wires; adding fresh oil if needed. Be sure to have spare parts for emergencies. Only use marine parts made for boats. Inspect the prop for damaged flutes, which cause vibrations and excess wear on all the drive components.

These are only a few things necessary, but as you think about what you need to do, more will surely be added to your checklist. Write your list and check off the items as you go. This is one of the best ways to have an enjoyable season boating. Get your Vessel Safety Checks done. We can do them at Beltzville Lake during our clean up, or when/where it is convenient for you. Contact a Vessel Check Examiners to set up an appointment.

Let's have a great time this year. Be safe and aware of all others around you. Hope to see you on the water this year.

Administrative Officer's Report



America's Boating Channel Urges Use of Engine Cut-Off Devices

Are you aware of the legal requirement for using engine cutoff devices? This is a requirement that could save your life. The requirement to use an engine cut-off switch (ECOS) took effect on April 1, 2021, and applies to all U.S. waterways, with fines of \$100, \$250, and \$500 for the first, second, and third offenses, respectively. State and local authorities may choose to enforce the law differently, but using an



engine cut-off switch is now the law for qualified vessels everywhere in the United States.

The law applies to all personal watercraft and recreational boats under 26 feet with motors capable of 115 pounds of static thrust (a little under 3 horsepower). Boats not currently equipped with an engine cut-off



switch are exempt, but that grandfather clause is closing fast. Another recent federal law required manufacturers to install engine cut-off switches on all new boats starting in January 2020.

Videos are available that offer an overview of the importance of specialized safety equipment for recreational boating that will shut down the engine in an emergency such as the boat operator falling overboard. America's Boating Channel™ produced these videos to help viewers learn about traditional lanvard type devices, as well as the new wireless systems.

Watching videos like <u>"Engine Cut-Off Devices"</u> (https://youtu.be/3J3M8dMzqTk) is an excellent way for boaters to prepare for safer experiences on the water. America's Boating Channel also produced a sequel entitled "Wear an ECOS" (https://youtu.be/i0Nu7Gu-JG0).

It covers differences between boating knowledge and boating skills and why it matters. Viewers learn approaches to take to improve their boating abilities.


