


# Obituary for Joseph 'Joey' D. Fedorak



Boating season is in full swing and we are spending as much time as possible on the water enjoying ourselves and making trips to places we know as well as visiting new locations.

Even though you checked all your equipment before the start of the season, now is a good time to recheck it to be sure it is still useable in case it is needed. Check the battery connections for corrosion and loose connections, which can affect the performance of electronics and other electrical components on board. Also check fuel lines and connections that could loosen or deteriorate as the boat is being used.

Check your emergency equipment, like life jackets, flares, and distress devices to be sure that batteries are good and water has not ruined anything. If the motor needs service, get it done so you are not dead in the water in the middle of a voyage. Always check the fluids in your motor before starting to assure proper levels and lubrications.

Let's all have a safe and enjoyable time this summer and remember to have fun.



## New Online Boating Accident Avoidance Course from BoatUS Foundation: 'S.C.A.N. – Improving Situational Awareness'

Takes on the biggest cause of accidents: distracted boating



A quick look at the <u>annual U.S. Coast Guard recreational boating accident statistics</u> shows "operator inattention" and "improper lookout" to be perennial placeholders in the top five primary contributing factors in boating accidents. A new online micro course, "<u>S.C.A.N. – Improving Boater Situational Awareness</u>," aims to address the issue head-on by helping boaters avoid distracted boating and enhance situational awareness and boating safety skills. The free accident-avoidance course is designed to make boating safety instruction accessible and fits into busy schedules, typically taking less than 30 minutes to complete.

Course takers will learn the importance of maintaining a proper lookout, understanding and applying the nautical rules of the road, and

mastering the S.C.A.N. method (Search, Concentrate, Analyze, Navigate) to help stay focused and avoid collisions. The course also covers common distractions and practical strategies to mitigate them, ensuring a safer and more enjoyable boating experience.

Through engaging video scenarios and interactive quizzes, learners will also practice key techniques and reinforce their knowledge. By the end of the course, students will be equipped with essential tools to navigate waterways confidently and responsibly.

"The growing list of distractions aboard a boat only made us more determined to offer a new and innovative accident avoidance course that will sharpen anyone's skills," said BoatUS Foundation Director of Boating Safety Ted Sensenbrenner.

The new course was created in partnership with a grant from the <u>U.S. Coast Guard Office of Boating Safety</u> and funding from the Sport Fish Restoration and Boating Trust Fund.

While the S.C.A.N. course does not meet any state education requirements, the Foundation separately offers the only <u>free online boating safety course</u> that provides required NASBLA boating safety certification in 37 states, as well as a range of other paid courses.

#### Did You Know?

Whale watching is one of the most interesting things you can add to your "Cool Things to Do on a Boat" list. And, you can plan a trip in close-by Belmar, New Jersey when you book tickets with Bill McKim's Jersey Shore Whale Watch Tour.

My family and I booked a 3-hour tour aboard the 120 foot Jersey Girl in Belmar, NJ this summer. We had a hot, sunny day and visibility was great, although the water was a bit choppy due to intermittent storms the previous day. We had researched many reviews and loved the vid-

eos of some whales caught on camera during previous outings and were very excited to hopefully catch some humpbacks or finback whales in ac-

tion.

With sunscreen applied, drinks at the ready, and sunglasses in place, we kept our eyes peeled for any movement in the water. The on-board marine biologist intern & naturalist narrated previ-

ous sightings, what to watch for, facts about dolphins and whales, and kept us in-

formed of our place on the water as the captain piloted us around. As we glided through the waters, we spotted many ospreys and double-crested cormorants as well as seagulls coasting over the water. We traveled to the upper deck to check out the view, and even snacked on a huge, shareable pretzel sold at the snack bar inside the boat. But even 2 hours into the ride, no whales. No dolphins. No sea turtles. Nada.


On the return ride, the captain took us a little closer to shore and extended our time on the boat by circling back to spots where well-known whale activity had taken place just a few days prior. Nothing. Now almost 3.5 hours in, the inlet just around the corner, and still no whale sightings.

It was a bit disappointing, but a true reminder that you cannot control nature and that any time on the water is an adventure, especially when traveling with family. Although we returned to the dock without having witnessed the slightest whale activity, we are looking forward to another day cruise based on the
