

As the weather gets warmer and the water temperatures begin to rise, the urge to get out and enjoy time on the water begins. Fishing, water skiing and cruising to name a few. Before starting, check your boat for all the necessary equipment for a safe time on the water. PFDs should be free of tears and the labels readable. Whistles are recommended to be attached to them. Check that your distress flares are within their expirations dates and that your first aid kits are stocked with fresh components. Check that navigation lights are working, your batteries are in good shape and fully charged, and that all electronic equipment is operating properly.

Get your Vessel Safety Check done to be sure all is in order. If you need a VSC contact your examiner to set up an appointment.

The park rangers were pleased to have us up at Beltzville for our clean up and VSC's and we are welcome to return again for more VSCs. They asked to call them to let them know when we are coming back. Thank you to the Park Rangers for their support to our community service.

Let's have a safe and enjoyable boating season.



There is now a credit card fee to pay with your card. When my bill arrives I will be mailing in a check. A stamp is a lot cheaper than the credit card fee.



Nature's Call and Drowning Risk





You may be surprised to hear that sometimes people drown while boating or swimming in open water (i.e. lakes, rivers, ponds, etc.) because they're taking a nature's call break and relieving themselves. Nobody expects that relieving yourself could cause you to drown, but those who have worked to recover bodies of those who have drown, reported that men were often found with their zippers down. This may sound comical at first, but if you've

lost a loved one to any type of water-related fatality, there's obviously nothing funny about it. This blog includes some of the more common activities that lead to drowning, along with what you can do to prevent being remembered by your family and friends as the one who could have survived if you had worn a life jacket It's easy to lose your balance and fall overboard while boating, especially if you're in a small vessel. Falls from vessels, docks, or shoreline were the second leading cause of drowning (21%), according to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) last year. Also, men were 95% of those who drowned and 91% were not wearing a life jacket, according to USACE, the nation's leading provider of water-based recreation.

Drowning risk isn't limited to those who fall overboard; there are many other ways that those who have entered the water intentionally have drowned. Sometimes a boat operator or passengers jump overboard (for whatever reasons) and they don't leave anybody on the boat that knows how to start or drive it. Then the boat drifts farther away than expected and people in the water drown attempting to get back to it. **Retrieving something (vessel, hat, etc.) or someone is one of the most common ways that people drown** because it's easy to exceed your swimming ability in open water. Last year, nearly half (49%) of those who drown on USACE waters were swimming in undesignated areas (not a designated swim beach area).

There are also people who enter open water intentionally to swim, float, or possibly relieve themselves; they jump in, go underwater, and never come back up. This is common whenever several boats are tied together or docked with engines or generators running. Nowadays it's more common for these types of fatalities to be looked into as possible carbon monoxide deaths. However, some people never find out why this type of drowning death happened, especially if the deceased's family didn't request an autopsy. Carbon monoxide can accumulate near the water's surface, especially on calm days with engines running nearby; it's a colorless, odorless gas that can kill you. One breath of it is enough to render someone unconscious, and if you're in the water, you can drown. To help prevent this from happening, you should always be wearing a properly-fitted life jacket when you're in, on, or near open water. Also, it's a good idea to purchase and use a portable hand-held carbon monoxide detector, if you plan on being in the water where vessel engines or generators have been running.

In all these types of incidents described, if people would have been wearing a life jacket, it could have considerably increased their chances of survival. So when you're in, on, or near open water, please make sure you're wearing a properly-fitted life jacket. Make your number one (pun intended) priority to be known for always wearing a life jacket in open water and for encouraging your friends and loved ones to wear one too; that could help save countless lives on our nation's waters.


