




We miss being able to get together, but let's stay in touch with the tools available, and use extra time at home to plan for a brighter future.




'Small Craft Warning'?

In a move that could simplify and potentially reduce misunderstanding of urgent weather messages used by recreational boaters to make critical boating safety decisions, the National Weather Service has proposed renaming "Small Craft Advisory" to "Small Craft Warning" and is asking for boaters' feedback.




ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

IS YOUR BOAT READY?

On May 6th, Governor Larry Hogan announced that recreational boating is again permitted on Maryland waterways. Like me, I am sure most all of you are ready to get back on the water again.


Usually at this time of year, with National Safe Boating week ready to begin May 16-22, it's time to start thinking about getting an annual Vessel Safety Check (VSC) on your boat and normally that can easily be

arranged. Unfortunately at this time, given the Covid-19 pandemic, the National USPS organization has not yet allowed squadrons to perform these checks. Despite this, there are a number of things that you can do to make sure your boat is safe and ready to go. The last thing you want is to be stopped by the US Coast Guard or DNR police and get a ticket for a safety violation.

Here is a list of the most common reasons boats fail an inspection:

- Registration not on the boat or out of date
- Visual Distress Signals (flares) expired
- Missing or inadequately charged fire extinguishers
- Lights not working
- Horn not working
- Too few or defective PFDs (life preservers) or no throwable flotation device on board

There are other items, but these are the most common reasons for failure. If you get ready to take your boat
