As I am sure you are, I am very saddened that we had to cancel our Change of Watch. It was the right call and I pray that you and your families are all safe and healthy at this tough time for our Nation and the world as a whole.

As Commander, I have a vision that 2020 (pun intended) will be a year of expansion in our public education. I have always had a heart for public safety, and feel that we can help so many more boat owners have a safer time on our waterways. I am not taking anything away from the wonderful work that the Squadron has been doing over the past several years. I just want to see us take our efforts to a new level and grow our family.

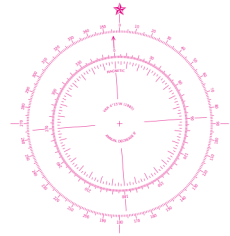

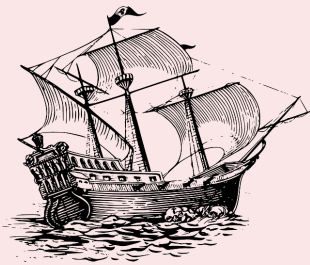

Fire Safety at home, by the grill or on the boat

In addition to smoke alarms, a good item to have in case a fire gets out of control, is a Fire Blanket. Keep one near the stove in your house and boat.

Install it on the wall at least several feet from the stove, so that you can grab it when there is a fire on the stove. Pull the blanket tab out of the holder and drape it over the flames to smother them. These are available from Lowes, Home Depot and other providers like the one linked below that has a demo video.

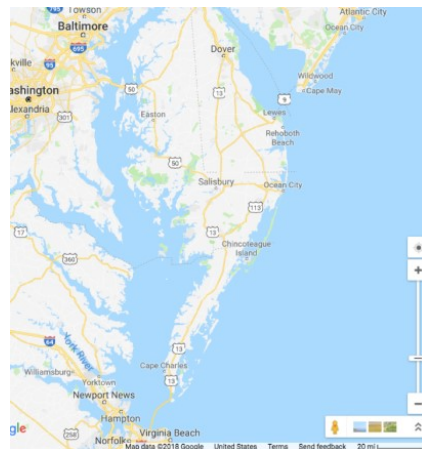
