## **Boating Course Records Have Gone "Paperless"**

As more and more states pass laws requiring specific levels of course completion, or knowledge demonstration, it is increasingly important that USPS maintain an accurate, active archive of all those who have completed our courses, for retrieval even years after a class was completed. Every squadron will now report the class roster and completion information using on-line tools to facilitate accurate and timely reporting of each successful student's record into the national database. Paper submissions are no longer being accepted. Not only is this a labor savings to the headquarters staff, but if on-line registrations are used, it is also a great relief to the squadron course personnel to not have to type every student's records into other tools to make class rosters, print certificates and wallet cards, and answer requests for certifications of completion to satisfy individual state requirements.

## **Boat Operator Certification**

This new program is gaining interest from many other boating organizations. As the message of BOC is carried outside of USPS, there is high potential for new members to be gained from those in other groups seeking the skill demonstration credentials available to every squadron. The initial cadre of certifiers is undergoing preparations to assist the local units in documenting current skills via waivers, and developing the next steps in achieving the Inland Navigation level.

## We Know Life Jackets Save Lives!

Recent evaluations of the boating fatality reports have convinced the US Coast Guard that more needs to be done to educate boaters to achieve the needed reduction in casualties. The USCG Recreational Boating Safety Program has developed a new mission statement: "To insure the public has a safe, secure, and enjoyable recreational boating experience by implementing programs that minimize the loss of life, personal injury, and property damage while cooperating with environmental and national security efforts." While the emphasis in recent years has focused on knowledge of PFDs, the new direction being implemented will seek to increase the percentage of adult wearing life jackets by at least 3% per year and will also more closely track boater basic and advanced education in both classroom and on-the water skill courses. The goal is to achieve a 5% annual decrease in the number of casualties. Since we do have a role in making these successes a reality, our approach to the public education courses is an important means to communicate in even stronger terms how valuable the wearing of life jackets is in preventing loss of life. Note the return of the term "life jacket" as being more meaningful in the education process than the legal term "PFD" currently found in the regulations. What we do in teaching boating safety to the public will be even more important and valuable – so keep on improving what we do.


