# Got the Winter Blues.... Try some Co-Op Charting

The Cooperative Charting year begins 1 April and ends on 31 March. We are, therefore, approximately one-half of the way through another cooperative charting year. Even with winter fast approaching there are still cooperative charting activities that can be done during the winter months. This is a good time to visit marinas and complete small craft facility reports. While doing this look at the latest edition of the nautical chart to be sure it is up-to-date. Take a look at what is written in the Coast Pilot book. If you see a discrepancy between what your read and what you see in the area; submit a cooperative charting report.

A brief note on Small Craft Facility reports. All small craft facilities being reported must appear on a small craft chart. Be careful of this as there are only four small craft charts in the District 5 area: Rappahannock River, Potomac River, and two charts along the Atlantic coast of New Jersey. The areas of these charts are outlined in green in the NOAA Catalog of Charts and Publications. Reports on facility capabilities on charts other than small craft charts should be reported as Coast Pilot updates.

When doing nautical chart updates, be sure to use the latest edition. On the Internet, check the dates of the latest chart editions using: <a href="https://www.nauticalcharts.noaa.gov/mcd/dole.htm">www.nauticalcharts.noaa.gov/mcd/dole.htm</a>.

If you wish to purchase the most current paper charts, try the new Print-on-Demand charts made available by OceanGrafix, Inc. Each corrected, up-to-date chart is custom printed to an order. Thank you for taking the time to be safe and be incompliance with State and Federal regulations. If you did not receive a Decal

— did you correct the item or items? You have a few months to get things ready for your Vessel Safety Check in spring so you can display your 2010 VSC Decal. All Squadron VSC Chairman should by now have cleared up any errors found in the error report on the VSC site. "PLEASE" have all VSC's recorded to National by December 28, 2009. This will allow the Committee to receive the final results to compile the Awards List in time for Spring Conference. 
# Notes and News from the D5 LAW COMMITTEE

Many people are uncertain about the difference between arbitration and mediation and many are not familiar with the idea of ADR, or alternate dispute resolution. Perhaps even fewer members are aware that the USPS Bylaws and Operations Manual provide for "Arbitration of Disputes."

Alternate dispute resolution ("ADR") refers to ways of settling disputes (peaceful ways) without recourse to a lawsuit. Mediation and arbitration are two examples of ADR, and there are others.

In mediation, a trained neutral person, the mediator, assists the parties to reach an agreement that resolves their dispute. The main feature of mediation is that it is entirely up to the parties themselves as to how they will, or will not, agree to a mutually agreeable (or equally disagreeable) result. No one forces them into the solution, but if they can reach an agreement, they are able to end their dispute and go on with their lives, businesses, careers, or whatever else has been interrupted by their dispute.

In contrast, arbitration is the process by which a neutral person (or a panel of three), the arbitrator (or arbitrators) makes a decision that is imposed upon the parties, usually finding or "award" in favor of one party or the other. One thing in common with



Most states have a provision in their statutes that allows an arbitration award to be entered as a judgment in favor of the winning party and against the losing party, thereby giving the arbitration award the force of law, and providing for enforcement as though there had been a trial in a court.

What makes arbitration attractive is that the parties choose their "judge" and "jury," they also can control the schedule to a greater extent than in a lawsuit, the proceedings move much more quickly and involve far less expense, and in most respects the process is much less complicated than in a court filed lawsuit.

Article 16 of both the USPS Bylaws and the USPS Operations Manual provide for arbitration of disputes by one squadron against another squadron, by a squadron against a district, by one district against a squadron or by one district against another district. Obviously, those categories do not include all types of disputes that may arise in the course of the affairs of squadrons or districts, not to mention national USPS, which appears to be free of these procedures. Why?

Article 16 should be reviewed to see the specific list of disputes and elaborate procedures of charges, responses, hearings, appeals and other steps along the way to a final result. The climax of all of this is an award that is binding upon the parties and "may be published in *The Ensign* if the Operating Committee, in its sole discretion, determines such publication to be in the best interests of USPS."

What about entry of the results in a court for enforcement? Section 16.12 provides:

There shall be *no recourse* from the proceedings provided for herein other than those specifically set forth in this article. *There shall be no liability or responsibility in law or equity upon USPS, any district or squadron, or any of its members, officers or employees,* either in connection with a charge or accusation made, hearings thereon, decisions and judgments, or failure to comply technically with the procedures set forth herein. (Emphasis added.)

So after all the process, procedures, pleadings, hearings, deliberations and decisions, the effects are limited to an internal decision that may or may not be published and that may *not* be enforced in a court of law. That, in effect, wipes out the enforceability of the arbitration provisions against a squadron or district that makes a claim in a court without bothering with the arbitration process. Again, why?

These are questions for the national organization to address.

## ATTENTION! USPS ENTERS CYBERSPACE!

That's right, we now have a Cyberspace Squadron. Last year at D5's Fall Conference, the plan to allow people to become a member using the WEB was announced. The system was actually implemented mid-September 2009. It is an easy procedure and it is working. Since its implementation, there are 85 Cyberspace Squadron Members. These members belong to USPS but do not belong to a squadron. Here's how it works. People who are surfing the web and visit USPS are asked if they want to become members. If they do, they click on the Member Button. They fill in their information and National charges them National fees and dues plus an average of the dues for the district and the squadrons near them. National then sends the information on these new members to the squadrons in their area. Each of the squadrons vie for their membership. In order for this to work, every squadron needs the email address of their personal contact. This person should be very personable and knowledgeable with the come on board attitude.

Last month we learned that most of D5 squadrons do not list this contact. This was a surprise for most of us. It seems that there is a simple spot on the OD2 form of DB2000 which most of us omitted to fill in! If we don't have a person with email contact, we will quickly fall into the pre 21<sup>st</sup> century world as almost everyone is on email – even my 90 year old aunt! An eletter went out to the district membership committee with instructions to bring your squadron up to date. If you did not receive this email, please contact me at seaurging@comcast.net and I'll be glad to help you get aboard.

#### THE ENSIGN & MARK V via CYBERSPACE

Squadrons are not the only ones who are missing out by not being listed properly on DB2000. The Ensign and Mark V are also distributed to everyone whose email is listed in DB2000. We learned at the Admins and Secretaries meetings at our recent Fall Conference, that most of us are not receiving these email issues. The Mark V sends out 3 hard-copy issues and 3 email issues. If you are not receiving these issues, go into DB2000 and check your email address. If it's wrong have it corrected. There is a special password that has to be used. Check with your commander/secretary to find out who can make this change.

### MARKETING TECHNIQUE PRESENTATION

Gretchen Cupples of Annapolis made a marketing presentation in the Membership Meeting. Although this presentation was based on use after the boating course, the theory or practice can be used ANYTIME a request is made. The procedure is simple. Listen to the person you are approaching to do something. Learn what's important to them. What do they want? Then offer them the opportunity to accomplish this. A good example of the opposite of this method is the committee who tried to have Chicago host the Olympics. In all their presentations they made, the message was what this would do for Chicago. 



# 2009 Sail Regatta Results!

The 2009 D5 Sail regatta is history. There was a mono-hull division and for the first time ever a multi-hull division. The weather became a factor in several ways. On Friday many of the entrants had to brave 20-30 knot winds with 5-6 foot seas in the afternoon. Two entrants (*Solon Mohr* and *Double Image*) suffered rigging damage and had to withdraw. I have to say that a harbor entrance never looked so good after 8-½ hrs underway and sailing over 52 miles from the Patapsco River.

We must have used up all the wind, because on Saturday the wind was only at 2-3 knots. Ironically the NWS called for 10-15 kts with "small craft advisories". Finally a breeze of 4.5 kts appeared. As You Wish (Howard Cupples' trimaran, Annapolis), Freedom (Harry Anderson, Wilmington), and Scandia (Rolf Steunes, Dundalk) got off in good shape. Hideaway (Alan Karpas, Rockville) and Event Horizon (Rockville, skippered by yours truly) had a sudden drop in the wind speed just before the starting gun. They finally got across the starting line after much heckling by the committee boat crew (Nansea Gale skippered by Jim Gorman from Potomac River) but never had good wind until the end of the race.

The three front-runners had a good time. *As You Wish* won line honors by a scant 20 seconds with a total time of 2:00:40 (this is comparable to a half-car length win in NASCAR). *Freedom* made a nice move at the second mark and passed *Scandia* to claim second overall, first in the mono-hull division (2:01:00). *Scandia* crossed the line third overall/second in division (2:19:15).

Event Horizon caught Hideaway on the second leg and managed to block what little wind she had. Unfortunately, with light wind and a big boat (50 ft) this can be fatal. Hideaway came to a dead stop for a few minutes and then took a long time to get moving again. At the line it was Event Horizon holding on for third (2:43:53) with Hideaway earning the coveted (?) "Busted Mast" award (2:45:05).

The award ceremony was a lot of fun, with several suggestions that with an average speed below 3.5 KPH we should have been trolling for fish instead. Nobody went away empty handed, with one exception: Some time after the ceremony the "Busted Mast" award mysteriously vanished, and despite a frantic search remained missing. According to Fuzzy Jones (who denies any involvement) it is safe "somewhere". However, she told me that if it can't be produced on demand at a district event, the current recipient might be liable for a round of drinks (similar to the "Old Sourpuss" award for the Nav contest loser). Later, "The "Busted Mast" award was eventually found and duly brought forward at the Fall Ed. Conference by CDR Alan Karpas, JN (Rockville).
