## Commander's Message

As we embark upon USPS<sup>®</sup> District 5's historic 75th Anniversary Year, it's interesting to contemplate the state of the union that we entered back in 1939.

Franklin D. Roosevelt was president; the US population was 131 million; federal spending was \$9.14 billion; unemployment stood at 17.2%; and postage stamps cost \$0.03. After Germany invaded Poland, occupied Bohemia, and renounced its pact with England, World War II began.

Closer to home on the Chesapeake Bay, the need for safe boating education was underscored. On 3 February 1939, a fast-moving squall swept up the Choptank River catching the oyster-dredging fleet unaware, leaving nine watermen dead, and sending several skipjacks and bugeyes to the bottom.

Also in D/5's inaugural year, Hewlett-Packard was founded; the CBS Television Network began transmission; and GM introduced the first fully automatic transmission. The NY Yankees won the World Series; Lou Gehrig retired. "Gone with the Wind" and "The Wizard of Oz" premiered; and the "Batman" comic book debuted.

As fascinating as looking back seventy-five years can be, the primary purpose of this message is to address current events in District 5.

We are very grateful to Dundalk Squadron P/C Tracey Stuenes, P for spearheading our participation in the Baltimore Boat Show. Thanks to her leadership, more than fifty prospective member leads were generated.

As reported elsewhere in this edition of Mark 5, both the National Annual Meeting & Celebration of the USPS<sup>®</sup> 100th Anniversary in Jacksonville, FL and the Centennial Cruise through the Eastern Caribbean that followed it were well represented by District 5 in attendance and appreciation.

Your District was proud to be among the eighteen whose Commanders sponsored Friday night "Yachty Gras" festivities that concluded with a Centennial Boat Parade and Fireworks.

It was enormously stimulating and inspirational to participate in the Saturday morning Opening Ceremony with 33 Districts presenting their Centennial Ensigns adorned with ribbons from some 400 Squadrons.

And it was deeply motivational to witness the USPS<sup>®</sup> proclamation from President Barack Obama and the strong endorsements of USPS<sup>®</sup> from numerous outside speakers representing all aspects of boating and water safety.

At this meeting, our D/5 Resolution regarding national meeting schedules was approved by a nearly unanimous vote of the Membership. The election of National Bridge Officers, Change of Watch Ceremony, and Mardi Gras Banquet completed the memorable highlights of this spectacular event.

Although winter storm "Pax" threatened the D/5 Winter Training Session, we persevered and trained incoming squadron bridge officers at the Maritime Institute in Linthicum, MD. 

# **USPS<sup>®</sup>** National Annual Meeting & Centennial Celebration

The National Annual Meeting and Celebration of the USPS<sup>®</sup> 100th Anniversary in Jacksonville, FL from 26 January to 2 February was well represented by District 5 in both attendance and appreciation.

National recognition to the District, our Squadrons, and our members began with Life Members (those members who have received 25 Merit Marks). See a complete listing on page 23.

Finley Sea Scout Service Awards went to P/D/C Brian Becker, AP; P/D/C Drex Bradshaw, AP; D/Lt Art Cournoyer, S; P/C James Gorman, AP; and Cdr Guy Thompson, JN.

2013 Squadron Membership Growth Awards ranged from Wilmington in the top two large squadrons nationally to Nanticoke River in the top three small squadrons nationally.

The Patuxent River Squadron received the Doing It Right Award.

Smith Mountain Lake ranked in the top five US Squadrons for Vessel Safety Checks (VSCs); and Art Cournoyer, S once again retained his membership in the Century Club for VSCs.

The BoatUS Distinguished Civic Service Award for Squadrons was accepted by Cdr Bill Schwieder, AP for Virginia Beach; and with D/5 placing in the top two Districts nationwide, P/D/C Brian Becker, AP accepted the District Award.

P/R/C Warren Stevens, SN was recognized for his major gift to the USPS<sup>®</sup> Century Fund.

1st/Lt Rolf Stuenes, JN of the Dundalk Squadron was named a Member Emeritus of the USPS<sup>®</sup> Governing Board upon earning 50 Merit Marks.

The D/5 Resolution opposing national meetings being scheduled on major religious holidays, as a result of extended negotiations with the National Board of Directors following the Governing Board meeting, was approved almost unanimously by the Membership in this amended version:

"NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the policy of the Governing Board of the United States Power Squadrons shall be not to schedule meetings, programs, events, or other activities on any dates that conflict with major religious observances."

After the election of National Bridge Officers, Change of Watch Ceremony, and festive Mardi Gras banquet in honor of our new National Chief Commander Robert Baldridge, SN, 350 members continued on to the Centennial Cruise aboard Holland America's MS Nieuw Amsterdam.

35 members and guests from ten D/5 Squadrons accounted for 10% of the USPS<sup>®</sup> guests aboard the ship, which cruised the eastern Caribbean with stops for celebratory activities conducted by District 33 in San Juan, Puerto Rico and the St. Thomas Sail & Power Squadron on that island. A highlight of the cruise was a VSC of the Nieuw Amsterdam performed by D/5's Century Club member Art Cournoyer and presented to the ship's Captain Edward Van Zaane in a special ceremony attended by the current and immediate past National Chief Commanders before leaving port in St. Thomas. # D/5 VSE Star Inspects USPS Centennial Cruise Ship

There's a reason Smith Mt. Lake Squadron Member Art Cournoyer, S is perennially elected to The Century Club for star Vessel Safety Examiners (VSEs) and is regularly ranked nationally among the handful of top performers in US Power Squadrons. The man breathes, eats, and dreams doing Vessel Safety Checks (VSCs). So it was not entirely unexpected that once aboard Holland America's MS Nieuw Amsterdam, as one of 350 USPS Members celebrating the 100th Anniversary of USPS on a fabulous Western Caribbean cruise, Art began to envision a glorious moment:

Completing a VSC of the 935-foot Signature Class Cruise Ship and presenting its Captain with a VSE form and decal, accompanied by newly installed National Chief Commander Robert Baldridge, SN and the immediate Past Chief John Alter, SN. Among the 35 District 5 Members aboard ship, it fell upon the shoulders of the D/C to provide Art with reality therapy so that if his aspirational dream could not be realized, he would not enter into clinical depression.

There were a number of hurdles to overcome – convincing the crew to even approach the rather intimidating Captain with this request, defining the scope of this inspection (how real versus how ceremonial), enlisting the support of the Chiefs, addressing logistics, etc. Instead of being dissuaded, Art handily recruited the D/C to serve as his enthusiastic assistant and, after two days of socializing, evangelizing, and selling the concept to the Ship Hotel Director, Chief Safety Officer, and others, amazingly, Art got the green light. The Captain would grant Art a fifteen-minute audience immediately prior to departure from port in St. Thomas. And the USPS National Chiefs would make themselves available.

For the subsequent two days, Art actually inspected the Nieuw Amsterdam: checking PFDs, navigation lights, and fire extinguishers; touring the galley that serves 3,000+ people daily; the six diesel generators and Azipod propulsion system; checking out the anchor, the links of rode chain for which are larger than most recreational boat anchors; etc. When the moment for the presentation finally came, the crew couldn't be more gracious and hospitable to their USPS visitors. By then, Art's entourage had expanded to also include fellow Smith Mt. Lake and Miles River Squadron Members and three photographers.

The Chief Operations Officer conducted a fascinating tour of the large-scale Navigation Bridge and its state-of-the-art equipment. Then, Captain Edward Van Zaane appeared on deck. Art reviewed the findings from his inspection, point by point by point. The rest of the USPS group present gazed attentively at the Captain to gauge his reaction. He volunteered some information about a government health inspection that ranked the ship very highly, and he asked Art about our conducting this service for recreational vessels.

When Art presented the completed VSC form – there was a momentary pause – then Captain Van Zaane signed it! Art presented the Captain with his decal, and the photo opp proceeded smoothly thereafter. The ceremony concluded with the Captain, in a lighthearted tone, inviting Art also to inspect the 22 lifeboats aboard the ship, time permitting.

24 Members arrived early for the outgoing and incoming D/5 Bridge Summit Meeting, Commanders Cocktail Party, Dinner, and motion-picture screening on Friday.

85 were present on Saturday for the full-day of training sessions. Registrar P/C Carole Tulip, JN operated a smooth registration process at the facility on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. Miles River Sail & Power Squadron also staffed a table promoting the 2014 Summer Council & Rendezvous, being held 1-3 August at Somers Cove Marina in Crisfield, MD.

The Winter Training Session commenced with a Year-in-Review slide-show movie narrated by D/C Marty Lafferty, AP.

After this opening plenary session, 2014-15 immediate P/Cs remained with Marty for training related to their upcoming roles. Squadron Commanders attended training facilitated by D/Lt/C Jim Colston, AP. Squadron X/Os were trained by D/Lt/C Fuzzy Jones, S. Squadron administrative officers were trained by D/1st/Lt Randy Stow, AP, SEOs received training from Stf/C Walter Neese, SN.
