SOUTH BOUND CRUISE 2015 OR "FUZZY'S FANTASEAS" By P/D/C Bernie Karpers, N

This year the South Bound cruise will start at the Sailing Emporium, Rock Hall, MD with a two night stay on 17 and 18 July. All types of vessels are invited, power boats, sail boats or trailer boats. Those on the cruise with sailboats will have the option of joining the cruise to Herrington Harbor, Cambridge, Tilghman on the Chesapeake, and Solomons, MD led by me, or they may wish to circumnavigate the Delmarva Peninsula with a cruise under the direction of Stf/C Alan Karpas, JN. Each cruise is described in detail on the District 5's website, www.d5usps.org. Those travelling by land are welcome to follow. You will find overnight accommodations near each stop on the South Bound Cruise.

The theme of the cruise on the Chesapeake Bay will focus on education and fun. Each night will feature a party on the dock sponsored by selected squadrons. On 21 July at Cambridge we can visit The University of Maryland Research Center for Environmental Science located at Horn Point on the Choptank River (UMES). There is no fee to visit this site. Transportation is needed. A stop within walking distance of our marina is the Richardson Maritime Museum and Boat Works. There is a \$5.00 fee to visit these sites. After a brief walk across the Maryland Avenue Bridge a "Dutch Treat" lunch is available at Cambridge Creek. Later in the afternoon for the first twenty persons that apply a \$15.00 per person fee will cover a two hour cruise on the skipjack, Nathan of Dorchester. The day will conclude with a No Host cocktail party and dinner, if you wish, at the Cambridge Yacht Club. At this time we are still working on arrangements for transportation to (UMES) at Horn Point and restaurants in the Cambridge Creek area. The transportation fee is expensive, and we are still trying to provide transportation. But it is looking very difficult to provide a reasonable fee for this service. There are four taxi cab service operators in the city of Cambridge all near our marina. Recognition and thank you is extended to D/Lt John O'Reilly, JN of Cambridge Sail and Power Squadron for making arrangements for our stop in Cambridge.

The stops at Sailing Emporium, Herrington Harbor South and Tilghman on the Chesapeake each feature picnic facilities and nice swimming pools.

The persons interested in the sail around the Delmarva Peninsula can view the description posted on the District 5 website. There are qualifications required to join this event. If you are a novice at ocean boating, and meet the qualifications, you will have an opportunity to hone your skills with the security of experienced open ocean boaters. The cruise will depart Rock Hall, transit the C and D Canal, spend a night at sea underway and arrive at Solomons on 23 July. Both groups can exchange tales of their experience at the District 5 Summer Rendezvous and Council meeting at Holiday Inn Conference Center and Marina Solomons, MD, 24 to 26 July 2015. D/LtC CM Kohlenberg, S of Nanticoke River Sail and Power Squadron was helpful in making firm our accommodations at Solomons. Thank you CM.

When you register for the South Bound Cruise, please provide a photograph of your vessel for the cruise publication which will be published by Ashle Cocca and Britne Bernard, the twin daughters of Nancy and David Bernard of Absecon Island Power Squadron. Deadline to be included in the roster of the cruise is 5 July 2015. That means I must have your registration material on 5 July.

District 5 Delmarva Circumnavigation Cruise To Summer Council & Rendezvous 17 July – 23 July, 2015

The Circumnavigation Cruise will be led by Stf/Cdr Alan Karpas, JN-CN from the Rockville Sail & Power Squadron.

17 - 19 July*: Join the D5 Southbound Cruisers at Sailing Emporium, Rock Hall, MD.

19 July: Depart Rock Hall for Delaware City Marina - 54.5 nm.

20 – 21 July: Depart Delaware City Marina for overnight sail to Cape Charles Town Harbor,

Cape Charles, MD – 192 nm.

22 – July 23: Depart Cape Charles for overnight sail to Holiday Inn & Marina, Solomons, MD

- 74.7 nm.

This cruise is open for any D/5 member wanting to experience overnight cruising. If you want to take your own boat, it must have a current VSC sticker, paper charts covering the cruising area, at least one DSC enabled VHF radio connected to a GPS and programmed with your MMSI number, a backup VHF radio, (handheld is acceptable) a chartplotter, and a backup GPS (handheld is acceptable). Radar and AIS are desirable, but not required.

All captains must have obtained the AP rating. Each boat should have sufficient competent crew to stand an overnight watch.

Members of D/5 who might want to crew on one of the boats should submit their names to Alan Karpas – alankarpas@verizon.net - and he will assign them to vessels short of crew.

UNITED STATES POWER SQUADRONS[®] 18TH ANNUAL BOARMAN YOUTH POSTER CONTEST PRESENTATION AT 2015 SPRING CONFERENCE

Eighteen years ago National was looking for someone to sponsor a safe boating youth poster contest. Vero Beach Power Squadron Past Commander Woody Boarman agreed to take on the responsibility.

Woody took a very personal interest in the children who entered the poster contest. In his home squadron, he displayed their posters, invited them to squadron affairs, and held a special luncheon each year in their honor. Vero Beach Power Squadron was very involved in the Woody Boarman Youth Poster contest.

The poster contest is open to all children between the ages of 6 and 14. The contest has 3 age groups 6-8, 9-11, and 12-14. The rules are simple and straightforward and are on the United States Power Squadrons (www.usps.org) website under youth activities. The theme of the 2015 contest is:

'If You Boat Be Sure You Float - Wear It".

Pretty easy and straightforward; not a difficult concept to explain to a child between the ages of 6 and 14.

How many squadrons have a person or committee directly responsible for publicizing and organizing the youth poster contest? I know of one, Delaware River Sail and Power Squadron.*

Does your squadron have a member who is a teacher, a child care professional, a scout leader, or someone who just loves working with children? These are ideal candidates to chair or become a member of your squadron's youth poster contest committee. We need to spread the word not just to our squadron members but to members of our communities as well.

We teach children the necessity and importance of wearing a life jacket. What better ways to make sure they understand it, than by having them show us on a poster? What better ways to make sure that we're getting the importance of the message across than by having them show us on a poster?

How many of our squadrons award prizes for their poster participants? Most just send off a certificate and letter. Would receiving a prize of \$5 or \$10 or a prize of equivalent value be more of an incentive? Why not explore the possibility of a sponsor for your squadron youth poster contest? I'm hoping D/5 will consider making a more substantial contribution and award a prize of some sort to our district winners. At the national level, a first, second and third place monetary prize is given in each age category.

Last year, 6 year old Olivia Dukakas, a resident of New York entered the contest representing Dundalk Power Squadron. At the national level she tied for second place in her age category.

D/5 recently received a check made out to her from USPS National in the amount of \$100. I will be very pleased to write a letter on behalf of D/5, thanking her for her participation and congratulating her on her accomplishment. I'm sure she'll be thrilled with her prize money and I know her Dundalk friends and sponsors, Bernie and Cathie Karpers, will be thrilled for and with her.

I sincerely hope our D/5 squadrons will have the same interest and take the same initiative in promoting the youth poster contest as did Woody Boarman and Vero Beach Power Squadron.

The Internal Revenue Service has determined it to be a "qualified organization" under section 501(C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

For the squadrons in District 5, this Fund has been a meaningful opportunity of support over the years. Recently, our involvement has dropped off, so we are looking at this program again and are setting a goal of returning to 100% involvement throughout District 5 by the year 2017. For 2015, we are shooting for 17 squadrons to participate; for 2016, 26 squadrons and 100% participation (33 squadrons) in 2017.

How do we get our squadron to be recognized as a member of the Education Fund Honor Roll? It's rather easy. To have your squadron recognized means that the squadron has made a donation of at least \$1 per member to the EdFund for the year. Simply check your DB2000 roster total to know the magic number. The \$1.00 per member per year can be achieved in many ways. Every squadron member can add \$1.00 per year to his or her dues renewal and designate it for the United States Power Squadrons Educational Fund; a squadron can send in an Honor Roll check for an amount equal to \$1.00 per member—money raised perhaps through a squadron fund-raiser; or one or more individuals in the squadron can make an equivalent donation and specify it as being for the Honor Roll for that squadron.

Congratulations to Delaware River, Delsea, Dundalk, Kingsway, Miles River, Ocean City, Patuxent River, Rockville, Virginia Beach squadrons for their participation in 2014. Now is the time to pass the hat, do a 50-50 raffle, look at your squadron budget to see if you can match personal donations, honor a 50-year member with a donation in that person's name. Let's ensure we'll continue to provide the best boating education ... support the Educational Fund.




