## 2016 NOAA Workshop

The annual District 5 Cooperative Charting workshop was held on 7 May 2015 at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Atlantic Marine Operations Center, Norfolk, Virginia.

D/Lt David Bernard, AP of Absecon Island Power Squadron, stepped up to the plate as he set up a great schedule of educational sessions to keep our D/5 members up to date on this long-standing program that has been a part of District 5 community service for more than 45 years. Lt Ryan Wartick from NOAA gave us an update of all that NOAA is doing. He also answered the many questions that came his way.

Geodetics was a very lively presentation. For some, this was the introduction to this support program and captured great interest. After reviewing the methods use to participate, we gathered outside to locate one marker, determining the location data needed to be updated. Our efforts then were to locate the 2<sup>nd</sup> marker on site, identifying the fact that it is "missing in action" (or maybe under about 2 feet of concrete). We anticipate a renewed interest in this program that can be done year round throughout the District.

D/Lt Steve Leishman, SN, a member of the National Cooperative Charting committee and Wilmington Sail & Power Squadron, shared with us information on ATONS and the Light List. This part of the inspection (the aids to navigation (ATON)) requiring taking notice of all ATONs, not just those with problems. The Light List is a database showing all lights, making it easy to find those in the area the squadron is serving.

The **A**dopt **a C**hart program is going strong, but a snafu has reared its ugly head. The program discussion was led by Zach Nelson, Virginia Beach Sail and Power Squadron. CCWeb (Cooperative Charting Website) has been shut down and will not be brought back in its current form. This action was taken because of possible security threats to the NOAA's marine charting division and the Office of Coast Survey (OCS) through this web site. NOAA will be trying to find another method for United States Power Squadrons members to participate but we can't expect anything soon.

NOAA and OCS have provided a way in which chart discrepancies (those issues that are truly vital to safety and navigation) can be reported. We may continue to process data through the Inquiry and Discrepancy Management System. Note that anyone can report chart discrepancies in this system. No provisions are made for review by the cooperative charting committee of the information being reported. Also, there is no way of determining cooperative charting credits for these reports at this time.

Zach also went over the Coast Pilot materials and reviewed what it can do for those of us who journey the Chesapeake Bay.

D/Lt John O'Reilly, JN, Cambridge Sail and Power Squadron, finished up the day with presentations on OpenCPN, Chart Navigator and MWSnap. Each of these programs helps us in supporting the overall Co-op Charting program.

The weekend concluded with dinner at the Sheraton Waterfront Hotel.

Thanks to  $D/1^{st}/Lt$  Frank and D/Lt Grace Brown of Nansemond River Power Squadron and Lt/C Gregg and Deb Martin, Virginia Beach Sail and Power Squadron, for hosting the hospitality room Friday evening at the hotel. This was a great weekend of education and fun.
