#### Comunander's Message

Actually, the year has flown by and I have had a lot of fun heading up the district. I'm not sure what I'll do with myself in April.

Thanks go to all the district commander's aides that attended the USPS® Annual Meeting in Florida. In the capable hands of chief aides John and Betty Wilmot they hosted a District 5 hospitality room on 14 February with a Valentine's Day theme. As usual everyone who attended got the message that in District 5 we are sticklers for doing things right.

The National Annual Meeting in Florida had several important outcomes deserving our note. First is that USPS has installed the first woman Chief Commander in its history. Mary Paige Abbott is a gregarious and thoughtful leader who I expect to have great success during her term. Second, we are proud to have two members of District 5 elected to the National Bridge in 2020. V/C William J. McManimen III, SN is our new National Educational Officer, and V/C Ralph A. Bernard, AP is National Administrative Officer. We offer Ralph, Bill and Mary Paige our support in their new roles.

Third is that Ralph Bernard's Rules committee delivered changes to the national bylaws that would allow squadrons to determine the coming year's meeting schedule in its executive committee and have it approved by squadron membership at its annual meeting. Ralph's committee accordingly adjusted the model squadron bylaws to provide for this. Your squadron would have to revise its own bylaws to adopt the language in the model before the new process would be legal. Remember that the goal is to have the ability to make meetings of the squadron membership and its social gatherings to be kept to what is fun and informative.

Fourth and last, as a response to abuses of the privilege, squadrons which choose a new America's Boating Club® local name to do business as, will have their name selections subjected to approval by vote at a district conference. Equally, new America's Boating Club names at the district level will be subject to Governing Board approval. You will hear more about these approvals at the conference in Ocean City.

I am looking forward to attending changes of watch at squadrons around the district through the month of March, as do my many loyal District 5 representatives. Please get your reservations in as soon as possible for District 5 Spring Conference on 26 March in Ocean City, Maryland. See you there!

Wednesday's tour of the Smith Mt. Lake Dam will trace its history to the nineteen-sixties when the dam was built at the point where the Roanoke River cuts through Smith Mountain. The visitor center and museum offer exhibits about the dam's origins and construction, and hydroelectric power in general. ### 2020 Fall Conference, 6-8 November 2020, Wyndham Gettysburg, Gettysburg, PA

Mark your calendars now for the 2020 D/5 Fall Conference to be held at the Wyndham Gettysburg in historic Gettysburg, PA. Along with the spectacular workshops and seminars, there will be a Ladies Tea & 1863 Fashion Luncheon. Gettysburg has much to offer:

#### **Gettysburg National Military Park Museum**

The new National Park Visitor Center museum houses an enormous collection of artifacts from the Battle of Gettysburg. There is an entrance fee to the museum. You can also arrange for a personal tour of the Battlefield with a licensed Battlefield Guide.

#### **Eisenhower Historic Site**

This is President Eisenhower's home. The tour leaves from the National Park Visitor Center and takes about an hour.

#### **David Wills House**

This museum is dedicated to Lincoln's visit to Gettysburg and the Gettysburg Address.


#### The Shriver House Museum

The historic home in downtown Gettysburg is focused on interpreting the civilian experience. The home is furnished as if the Shriver family still lived there. The home was occupied by the Confederates during the battle. You can even see the holes where the sharpshooters knocked out bricks to shoot onto the street below.

#### **Seminary Ridge Museum**

Seminary Ridge Museum, located on Seminary Ridge, has three floors of exhibits that explore the dilemmas that shaped the Civil War, the first day of the Battle of Gettys-

burg, and the Seminary's role as a Civil War field hospital. The museum also offers tours of the building's cupola, where Brigadier General John Buford stood as he plotted troop movements on the first day of the battle.



Utilizing artifacts, historical documents, interactive displays and 3-D productions, visitors will gain a better understanding of the events that took place in the town before, during and after the battle. Find out how people reacted to the invasion of the town; freeze, flee or fight? Hear accounts of ordinary people doing extraordinary things in a time when their home was in turmoil.

#### Horseback Riding, Bicycling & Carriage Rides

You can bring your own horse and ride the National Park trails or you can join one of the horse tours that are offered in the warmer seasons. The Victorian Carriage Company offers rides in warmer weather.







Bicycling is a good way to see the National Park.

#### Antiques, Artifacts, Reproduction, Books and Outlet Shopping

Gettysburg has a large selection of boutique shops specializing in art and history. There is an outlet mall, *The Outlet Shoppes at Gettysburg*, on the edge of town on Baltimore Pike.

#### Report of the USPS, America's Boating Club, Annual Meeting

The United States Power Squadrons, America's Boating Club, met at the Sawgrass Marriott near Jacksonville, Florida from 12 to 16 February, 2020. There were many seminars from Boating Education and how to better your ABC Classes and On-the-Water Training and how to increase membership and retention. Attending these seminars is very beneficial as you meet other members from different parts of the country and take some of their ideas and use them as your own. The exchange of ideas and the way other squadrons are accomplishing the same goals as your own, but maybe in a different way, can only help in the overall mission of our organization. Socially, there were many events where members were able to renew old friendships and make new ones. One of the top events was the Gala of America's Boating Channel hosted by Marty and Sari Lafferty. What was supposed to be a small gathering of the members who assisted in making the fantastic videos on boating education turned out to be a blockbuster with over 125 members in attendance. I believe the event took over the entire restaurant...Great job Marty and Sari.

The Governing Board met on Saturday and there were four (4) National By-Law changes:

- Section 1.1.1: If a District wants to use a DBA (doing business as), they would have to have that name approved by the Board of Directors. If a squadron wants to use a DBA, the name will have to be approved by the District Council/Conference. The rationale for this change was to protect historic territory by a particular squadron and if the opportunity arose to start a new squadron, the name would not cover so much area that this could not be accomplished.
- Section 3.4: This change gives the individual squadron the flexibility to decide whether it wants to have the Executive Committee approve a new member or just accept the new member. The rationale was to keep squadrons in line with the Cyber Squadron or if they can have the flexibility to do whatever is best for their own squadron.
- Section 3.6: This is a "housekeeping" change as the words are changed from "willing to contribute time, energy, and skills" to "willing to promote and advance" the objectives of United States Power Squadrons. This is to keep up with the language of the time.
- Section 10.3.3.4: Since a By-Law change was made at a prior Governing Board giving the National organization the flexibility to have only one Governing Board meeting, a new by -law was written giving the organization the ability to have electronic voting. This is also an attempt to keep up with the electronic age.

At the end of the Governing Board meeting, United States Power Squadron, America's Boating Club, entered a new age when Mary Paige Abbott was installed as the first female Chief Commander. This breaks a new barrier that has existed for 106 years. Another milestone for District 5 was the fact that two members of District 5 were installed on the National Bridge, William "Bill" McManimen, SN as the new National Education Officer and Ralph Bernard, AP as the National Administrative Officer. In attempting to look at history, District 5 has not had two members simultaneously on the National Bridge before. Additionally, another honor was bestowed to one our D/5 members, PDC Frank Dougherty, Jr. in receiving his 50<sup>th</sup> Merit Mark; now joining his brother Tom Dougherty in reaching that milestone.

If you have not attended a National Meeting, it is worth traveling to one. Not only do you meet new people but you get the opportunity to utilize ideas from other parts of the country. The next National Meeting is scheduled to be held in Raleigh, North Carolina on 9-12 September, 2020.






### Educational Cruise on the Delaware River

M/V Ben Franklin departs from 101 S Christopher Columbus Blvd, Philadelphia, PA which is just NORTH of the Ben Franklin Bridge. If you are heading south into Philadelphia on 195, please take the right hand lane at EXIT 22, for Callowshill Street. At the bottom of the off ramp, turn left on Callowhill Street and go several blocks. Turn left on North Columbus Boulevard. You will almost immediately come upon the parking lot at #101 where you will find ample parking. Coming north into Philadelphia, be sure to exit onto Columbus Boulevard South of the Ben Franklin Bridge.
