#### 2022 America's Boating Club Mid-Atlantic Fall Conference



Get ready for a truly unique Fall Conference at a beautiful facility. The Maritime Institute Conference Center in Lithi-

cum Heights, MD is the site for our Fall Conference 3-6 November. The Educational Department is hard at work preparing for educational and informative seminars and workshops.

The format for the weekend is a lot different from the previous years. The cost for the hotel rooms are \$159.00 per person for single occupancy and \$204.00 for double occupancy, plus applicable taxes. This includes your breakfasts and dinners (including the Saturday evening awards dinner). Friday and Saturday seminars are \$80.00 each day and include the following: Refreshments for a break in the morning and one in the afternoon, lunch and the cost of the use of facilities. Each attendee is required to pay the \$80.00 per day fee for the workshops and seminars. Those of you who are not staying at the institute but would like to attend the banquet the cost is \$45.00.

This may seem expensive, but if you break it down, it is actually less expensive than the typical conference.

# **Cooperative Charting: A Program for All Members**

The Cooperative Charting Program of the United States Power Squadrons is conducted in close cooperation with the United States Army Corps of Engineers, the United States Coast Guard, and NOAA's National Geodetic Survey Division (NGSD). The program continues to be a major public service of USPS. As in the past, members supply important information to the above agencies so updates can be made to nautical charts and the National Survey Marker databases.

The Aid-To-Navigation and Bridge Inspection programs support the USACE and Coast Guard in assuring waterways are properly marked and maintained. It is a great program to get members out on the water. The reporting requirements have been streamlined and it is easily completed online.

The Cooperative Charting Committee maintains a Geodetic Program where members help to verify the accuracy of reference points established on the surface of the earth by local, state, and national agencies. Maintenance and preservation of these marks are of utmost importance to users of the net and to NGSD. Recognizing that many valuable geodetic marks are destroyed by construction, new roads, erosion, or other causes, our job is to locate each of these marks and report their condition together with any change in the directions needed to locate them. This is another great program in which squadrons/clubs can participate. You don't need a boat; just a willingness to search along roads and trails finding these markers. It is a program that brings out our members.

We have been complimented by government leadership that our Cooperative Charting Program is recognized as an effective user-participation program. Try it!

# America's Boating Channel Steps Up to the Next Level

United States Power Squadrons' (USPS) boating safety and boater education video service, America's Boating Channel, received awards for being the Top Marine Media Outlet in 2021 and for producing the best PSA Video Series in 2022, but its most meaningful award came in the form of increased support from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG).

In June, the USCG awarded USPS a new grant covering the period July 1, 2022 through September 30, 2025 to substantially expand America's Boating Channel into a mainstream media offering. The video service, which has benefited enormously from District 5 participation during its first six years, will now focus on four growth areas.

## **New Video Series**

Twelve new titles will be developed, produced, and distributed each year as America's Boating Channel's seventh through ninth seasons of boating safety and boater education videos. For the upcoming 2023 season's series of twelve videos, topics under consideration include border crossing; preventing slips, trips, and falls; partnering in command; disembarking hazards; boating with small children; engine



failure causes and cures; towed sports safety; tying dock lines; introducing AIS (Automatic Identification System); marine radio etiquette; navigating locks; and why wearing life jackets is cool – for example by enabling wearers to keep their smartphones dry for taking selfies.

## **Viewership Promotion**



America's Boating Channel will stimulate video viewership with a stepped-up marketing campaign, including daily posts across multiple social networks and media outlets designed to creatively alert and memorably impress upon the boating public the inherent risks associated with boating. to persuade recreational boaters to adopt safe boating behaviors, and to

remind them of these behaviors with creative variations on promotional campaign themes. Our participation in National Safe Boating Week and Operation Dry Water and exploration of social media platforms with youthful demographics in 2022 also will be expanded.

## Smart TV

America's Boating Channel's new smart TV initiative will include the technological development, commercial launch, and ongoing operation of a new free-to-the-user smart TV boating app offering safe boating videos on demand in a format like Hulu, Netflix, and Amazon Prime. The new app will offer additional boating-related sports, news, and entertainment. A no-cost smart TV linear video programming channel,



which will play safe boating content as well as boating-related TV shows on a continuously playing schedule, like ESPN, The Golf Channel, and the Tennis Channel will supplement its on-demand title-by-title app for a more traditional television viewing experience.

## Inlet Drone Videos



America's Boating Channel will launch a new video service offering based on the video concept tested during 2022 that will feature low altitude drone shots of leaving from and returning to major US waterways across the nation with narrative explanations to prepare recreational boaters for their first sorties into these ports, harbors, rivers, and other high traffic entrances. The rollout will

include a training system with production technical details and processes for creating such videos for participants nationwide to accelerate coverage of more locations, as well as a business model that will generate supplemental program income to support this offering.

There are opportunities to use America's Boating Channel for education as well as membership recruitment, development, and retention.
