This year's Summer Council (29-31 July) will be at Rock Hall Landing Marina in beautiful Rock Hall, Maryland, "The Pearl of the Chesapeake." This marina is under new ownership and they have upgraded the motel rooms and marina bathrooms and have built a new firepit and seating area.

We have several activities planned, including a predicted log contest, fishing contest, and lawn and pool games, as well as multiple social gatherings.

Our location is right next to Waterman's Crab House Restaurant and is a short walk to Harbor Shack Restaurant. Both feature live music and a great atmosphere. Bikes are available at the marina, which is less than a half mile to the center of town where you can enjoy shops, a coffeehouse, an open-air market, and of course, ice cream. While exploring the town, be sure to visit Ferry Park, which is a small sandy beach for sunbathing, splashing in the Chesapeake Bay, or watching the sunset.

Please visit the Main Street Rock Hall website (<u>mainstreetrockhall.org/</u>) to view videos that showcase the local businesses.

While in Rock Hall, please be sure to take advantage of several of the charter boats available for fishing as well as Blue Crab Charters, which features sunset cruises on "Island Girl," a 43 Morgan center cockpit sailboat. About 10 minutes south of Rock Hall is Eastern Neck National Wildlife Refuge, which is a 2300-acre island providing walking trails and bird watching opportunities.

On The Water Skills Demonstration For IN, CN, and ACN certification

Where: On the Chesapeake Bay in the vicinity of Kent Narrows, MD

When: 0900 25 - 26 June 2022

Boat Schools were created by the Boat Operator Certification Committee of USPS for the purpose of organizing regional events that bring together certification candidates and certifiers in one location. This method combines all the resources needed in one location to allow certification candidates to complete their on the water skill demonstrations in a four hour period.

Certifiers will be available to certify candidates' abilities during skill demonstrations for Inland Navigator (IN), Coastal Navigator (CN) and Advanced Coastal Navigator (ACN). These are not training sessions. The candidate is expected to have experience performing the various required skills and can demonstrate those skills to the certifier.

The required skills are listed in the guides and checklist for the three certification levels and are available for download on the USPS Boat Operator Certification Web Page. After logging on to USPS.org click on the below link:
