# End of Season Delight: Visiting the Sultana Downrigging Festival by Boat

For the last two years, Vicky and I ended our season with an excursion up the Chester River to anchor at the *Sultana* Downrigging Festival in Chestertown, MD. This is a great event allowing you to sail among these majestic symbols of a bygone era as they glide smoothly through the water.

This year the weekend was expected to be stunning... temps in the high 70s low wind, so no real sailing, but a nice calm motoring up the Chester River to Chestertown. While not quite peak foliage in this area, there was still an incredible amount of color in the leaves in places along the river.

Because of the weather, we took Friday off and arrived in the area just in time to see these tall ships returning north to the Chestertown Marina. We found our way past them and selected a spot to anchor just south of the marina.

Once they returned to the dock on Friday evening, we prepared some steaks and salad to enjoy as we watched the sunset and full moon rise on opposite sides of the river. As darkness approached, we were treated to the illumination of the ships' rigging. At 8:00 PM we discovered that we were anchored right opposite the launch point for the evening fireworks at Wilmer Park and viewed the fireworks from our ringside spot.

As evening wore on, we found ourselves amid a veritable constellation of anchor lights.

Saturday morning, we watched as the ships paraded past our anchorage and then hauled anchor and followed them for a bit before returning south on the Chester River and eventually back to Rock Hall, MD.

# **Boating Safety**

### **Brief Your Crew**

Before heading out for a day on the water, be sure to brief your crew. Talk to your passengers about your boat and make sure you have someone on board who knows how to operate it should you become incapacitated. A crew briefing can make running your boat easier and your guests feel safer.

Here are some things you should consider covering:

- Where to find life jackets, a first-aid kit, visual distress signals and fire
  extinguishers. Be sure to offer life jackets to your guests and encourage
  everyone to wear them. Additionally, point out the best places to sit on
  board and remind them to spread out and not all sit or stand on one
  side of the boat.
- How to operate the VHF marine radio in case of an emergency. Most people know that radios are "push to talk," but in an emergency, they forget to "release to listen."
- How you will handle docking procedures and what help you expect
  when you get to your destination. You don't want to be unprepared for
  docking. Although everyone wants to help, they may not know the best
  way to do so. Covering this ahead of time helps avoid last-minute
  confusion and mishaps.
- While you're at it, discuss the route so they understand what they will see along the way. Visitors may not be familiar with local waters.
   Helping them appreciate what they are about to experience sets the stage for a fun day.

Finally, always have someone on board who can be your partner in command. This person should be able to operate your boat and get everyone home safely (or to a designated access point where help is available) if you become incapacitated. Taking time to brief your crew will help everyone stay safe and have more fun on the water.
